### Unity Lack Hurts NATO

WASHINGTON (AP) — NATO's Secretary General Paul-Henri Spaak says the real weakness of the Atlantic Alliance is a lack of unity among its 15 sovereign members.

Spaak cited as one example France's atomic work, on which he said France is spending billions of francs to find information its allies already know.

Spaak expressed his views in an article in the current issue of the magazine *Foreign Affairs*. A three-time prime minister of Belgium, Spaak moved to the top NATO staff job in 1957. He is due in Washington today for the Atlantic Pact organization's 10th anniversary meeting.

Spaak called NATO a flourishing organization which he credited with halting Soviet expansion in Europe. However, he said, "common-sense solutions seem to be running head on into stubborn forces of nationalism and individualism within the alliance."

### Inventor Of New Device Says Sonar Now Obsolete

PERTH AMBOY, N. J. (AP) — will detect it, says Vernon M. Bugg, a 65-year-old inventor.

Bugg claimed Tuesday that his "mediowave system" will make sonar obsolete. Sonar is the Navy's present method of underwater detection. Using sounds and echoes, it has a limited range.

A Navy spokesman in Washington Tuesday confirmed that the Navy knew of the mediowave system and said "if the system proves of potential value, the Navy would be anxious not to publicize it in view of contributions to the nation's security."

But the system has already been publicized in area newspapers. And Bugg himself thinks his invention has already proved itself of potential value.

### Record Notes Solons' Dole

WASHINGTON (AP) — Government funds were paid to five political organizations for congressional office space during 1957-58, House records show.

The records also show that 12 House members rented space from persons or organizations with the same family name.

Made public by the House disbursing clerk, the records are for the year ended last June 30. Rental vouchers for the current fiscal year which started last July 1 will not be available until later.

House members, according to law, are allowed \$1,200 a year to rent office space in their home districts when free space is not available in government buildings.

The records show these amounts as having been paid to political organizations for office rental for the following members or former members:

- Rep. James C. Healey (D-N.Y.), \$1,025 to the Sedgewick Democratic Club, New York City, in 1957.
- Former Rep. Emmet F. Byrne (R-Ill.), \$1,250 to the 19th Ward Republican organization, Chicago, during 1957 and 1958.
- Former Rep. James B. Bowler (D-Ill.), \$300 to the 25th Ward regular Democratic organization, Chicago, in 1957.
- Rep. Charles M. Teague (R-Calif.), \$1,025 to the Ventura County Republican Central Committee, in 1957 and 1958.
- Rep. Jack Westland (R-Wash.), \$300 in 1956 to the Republican Central Committee, Everett, Wash.

### Oregon Hit By Epidemic

PORTLAND (AP) — Oregon is undergoing an epidemic of influenza-like illness, the state Board of Health said Tuesday.

Although the cases are being listed as influenza, there still is no laboratory confirmation of flu from any of the few specimens submitted for examination during recent weeks, a board announcement said.

The board said some of the cases may be caused by other viruses which produce influenza-like illness.

However, regardless of the cause, the board said, the current epidemic is the third worst in Oregon's history—exceeded only by World War I flu outbreak and the Asian Flu of 1957.

There were 3,545 cases reported last week, the board said, compared with 2,496 the previous week.
