History Van Coming Here

The Oregon Centennial Van of History will be in Klamath Falls Monday through Thursday of next week in front of the J. C. Penney Company store at Eighth and Main streets.

The van, sponsored jointly by the Oregon Centennial Commission and the Oregon State Historical Society, was dedicated September 17 in Oregon City by Sen. Richard Neuberger and Tom McCall. It has visited nearly all county seats in the state.

The van will be open to the public Monday from 10 a.m. until 6 p.m., Tuesday and Wednesday from 9 a.m. until 8 p.m., and Thursday from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. A fee will be on duty during those hours.

One item on display is a printing press used in the Oregon Territory—first, by Dr. Henry Spaulding at Clearwater Mission at Lapwai near what is now Lewiston, Idaho.

Others are the log book of the ship Columbia, sage brush sandals from the Fort Rock area, and the combined sword-cane and walking stick owned by Dr. John McLaughlin.
