Water Supply Meet Slated

The annual water supply forecast meeting to be held at Klamath Falls has been set for Monday, April 6, in the lecture room at the county fairgrounds, 3 p.m. W. T. Frost, snow survey supervisor, Soil Conservation Service, of Portland, will report on water conditions as they exist in the Klamath Basin at the present time.

Since the water supply this year is far below normal, experts indicate that this will be a short water season, particularly for those lands not provided with adequate reservoir facilities. All details of the outlook for each important water source in the Klamath area

will be developed at the April 6 meeting. In addition Frost will attempt to develop answers to water user's questions as to how they can best use the water they have. Manes Barton, assistant snow survey supervisor, will aid in the presentation of snow, soil and moisture, groundwater, recent runoff and streamflow forecast data at this meeting.

A coffee hour for discussion of Klamath County Centennial plans is to be held starting at 10 a.m. on Monday in the Cantax Room of the Winema Hotel with the hotel providing coffee for the guests.
