Board Orders Jail Probe

DORRIS-A state inspection of the earthquake weakened walls of the Siskiyou County Jail at Yreka was ordered last week by the board of supervisors before the county begins the proposed \$52,000 renovation project.

County Surveyor Anthony Canino and consulting engineer Oscar Piemme, Yreka, reported to the board that the sandstone walls of the old jail have been weakened by slight tremors and pointed out to the board that the walls were built in 1906 and probably would not bear any additional pressure from the proposed new upper floors.

Both the surveyor and engineer suggested the old jail be razed and a new structure costing approximately \$150,000 be built with a capacity for 100 prisoners, including larger facilities for women and juveniles.

At present, juveniles occupy one small cell in the county jail. Two small cells are used to imprison women prisoners. The remodeling plan would provide for cell rooms for 20 juveniles and women.

Sheriff Al Cottar told the board that the new plans "would not eliminate the need for a juvenile hall."

Probation Officer Jesse Brewer said he feels "it isn't going to help at all dependent children or children under 14 years of age."

Both men agreed that a new juvenile hall would have to be constructed.

Solon Lauds KF Voters

State Sen. Harry D. Boivin stated by telephone Monday afternoon that he had received a very gratifying response to his advertising request for expressions of personal opinion of Klamath County voters on Senate Bill 495.

The response, he said, favored the adoption of a three per cent sales tax to be used for educational purposes at a ratio of about four and one-half in favor to one opposed.

Just over a half dozen replies indicated approval of a general sales tax but disapproval of one which would be earmarked for a particular department.

The bill, which was introduced by Sen. Walter J. Pearson, Democrat of Multnomah County, calls for increasing to \$150 per census child the state aid funds and any excess of that amount to go back into the state's general fund. It calls for cutting individual income taxes and property taxes. It would be referred to the voters for final approval and would become effective on July 1, 1962.

Senator Boivin said the bill has passed the Senate with a wide majority and has gone to the House.
