TOKYO (AP)—Communist China aims to produce 18 million tons of steel this year—7 million more than it says it turned out in 1958.

Peiping radio said today other industrial targets fixed by the Communist party's Central Committee are 380 million tons of coal, an increase of 110 million tons; 525 million tons of grain, up 150 million tons; and 5 million tons of cotton, up 1 1/2 million.
