SF Giants Meet SL Tonight

ST. LOUIS, Mo. (UPI) — San Francisco's Giants put their National League pennant chances on the line here tonight when they tangle with the St. Louis Cardinals in their official opening game of the season.

Manager Bill Rigney has nominated left-hander Johnny Antonelli (16-13 last year) as the starter. For the Cardinals, manager Solly Hemus has named Larry Jackson (13-13 last year).

A crowd of about 25,000 is expected. The weather man says "cool temperatures, with a chance of thundershowers."

The two doubtful spots in the San Francisco line-up are at short-stop and right field. Rigney says he will start Andre Rodgers at short and Willie Kirkland in right. But the manager admits they may not be there long.

If Kirkland fails to hit, he'll be replaced by Felipe Alou; and if Rodgers has trouble with his fielding and/or hitting, the man waiting for the job is Eddie Bressoud.

There isn't a really strange face in the whole San Francisco line-up. The newest man is Jackie Brandt, who will start in right field. Brandt, who has clouted at a .333 clip in spring training, played 18 games with the club last fall and hit .250.

As he awaited the opening ball, Rigney predicted that his club would be in the race.

"We'll score runs," he said. "I won't predict a pennant. But with our power at the plate it is possible."

Rigney believes that two things could hurt the Giant pennant chances — lack of pitching depth and mistakes caused by lack of experience.

"But the boss, Horace Stoneham, says we'll finish on top," said Rigney, "and he's a competent judge."

The big change in the Giant infield is the shifting of Daryl Spencer to second base. Daryl was one of the top shortstops in the league last year, but moved to second this season for the good of the team. Sophomore Jimmy Davenport will be at third and Orlando Cepeda, 1958 Rookie of the Year, at first.

Bob Schmidt will catch with Kirkland, Brandt and Willie Mays in the outfield.

In all, the Beavers will take 22 athletes to Moscow.

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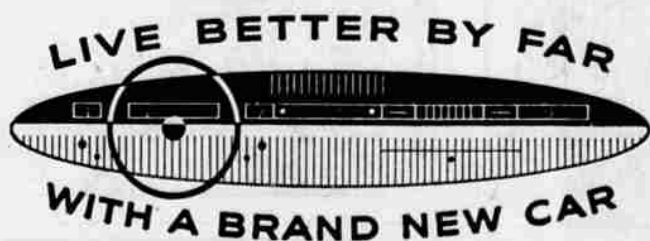
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
