

Top Horses Enter Fete

RED BLUFF—Another outstanding field of thoroughbred and quarter horses have been entered for the races at the Red Bluff Roundup on April 18 and 19, Walt Forbes, racing director, announced today.

Already 45 owners have entered and it is expected that a total of 75 will sign up for rodeo time, Forbes said.

Four relay strings will be featured in the mile and one half relay race each day, always the most exciting race on the card when jockeys change horses on the fly in front of the grandstand.

The racing program will feature a quarter horse race for quarter horses only and another featured quarter mile race in which both quarter horses and thoroughbreds will compete.

Other races will include a four and one-half furlong race and the featured three quarter mile Handicap.

Horses from throughout Northern California, Oregon, Washington, Nevada and Arizona will run on the two day card.

The Red Bluff Roundup is one of the few rodeos in the nation to present a complete racing program in connection with the regular arena rodeo events.
