

Traffic Court Actions Reach All-Time High

Traffic violation convictions reported to the Department of Motor Vehicles reached an all-time monthly high in March with courts

forwarding 16,530 abstracts to the state office. The March figure surpassed the number reported a year ago that

month by more than 2,600. The previous high for any month was in October last year when 14,988 convictions were reported. Much of the increase, officials said, is due to better reporting by courts.

Department officials said 230 of the convictions reported were for driving while intoxicated, a charge which calls for mandatory suspen-

sion of the convicted driver's license. The department's financial responsibility division received 362 additional abstracts for action, as a result of convictions on charges

of driving on a suspended or revoked license and previous involvement with the state's financial responsibility laws. Judges recommended the depart-

ment temporarily "ground" 186 drivers after convicting them of violations, including reckless driving, violation of basic rule and hit

The department exercised discretionary authority to temporarily suspend licenses of 233 drivers, most of them on the basis of unsafe driving records during recent

months. Other reasons included violation of license provisions, failure to pass tests, fatal accident involvement, physical condition or medical report.

Bolshoi Ballet Slates Debut

NEW YORK (AP) — The famed Bolshoi Ballet makes its long-awaited American debut Thursday night in the Metropolitan Opera House.

The Soviet company will open its 10-week stay in America with "Romeo and Juliet," starring its Prima ballerina, the legendary Galina Ulanova.

Brought here by impresario Sol Hurok, the troupe will include a second ballerina of first rank, Maya Plisetskaya, creator of the company's "Stone Flower." She has not danced outside the Soviet Union before.

Tickets for opening night have a \$50 top, for other nights, \$15. Advance sales were phenomenally high. When the box office opened, after mail applications

had been handled, there were 1,000 potential patrons in line with hardly enough seats left to take care even of them.

The company will play in Toronto and Montreal, and Los Angeles and San Francisco.

Besides "Romeo and Juliet" and "Stone Flower," the repertory includes "Giselle" and "Swan Lake" and two highlights programs, one of them featuring a section from "Spartacus." The second of these special programs is for newly scheduled Madison Square Garden appearances in May for the benefit of ballet lovers who couldn't get into the Met.

Two Clocks Are Legacy

NEW YORK (AP) — Tommy Manville, the much-married millionaire, was left two clocks by his late sister, Clare Lorraine Manville, it was disclosed by a copy of her will filed Thursday in Surrogate Court.

Miss Manville, who died last March 8, left the bulk of her 3-million-dollar estate to her daughter, Lorraine Manville Amato.

Miss Manville herself was married four times, her brother 10 times.

In leaving Manville two jeweled clocks, the sister declared in her will: "Although I have deep love and affection for my brother, I have intentionally omitted leaving any of my estate to him ... because he has ample funds of his own."
