Congressman Visits Yreka, Addresses Luncheon Meet

DORRIS — Congressman Harold T. (Bib) Johnson (D) visited Yreka in his swing to his 19 county second, valley mountain, district, and at a luncheon at the Yreka Inn recently spoke to more than 60 constituents.

Johnson spoke of the many problems in his district, as well as national affairs. He called the Eisenhower administration budget unrealistic, and said it is up to the Democrats to bring the budget into line. He spoke of foreign aid, domestic problems and of the national economy. Johnson said unemployment worsens and that the depressed areas, after using all our own resources, are on charity.

We are moving, said Johnson, to stop inflation. The \$297 million for airports will provide employment in construction of landing and take-off, pointing out, too, that we are moving into the jet age. Johnson spoke of the need of housing and federal loans and grants and federal aid to education. He said 600 million dollars has been allocated for school construction.

He spoke at some length on the need for flood control, mineral, timber, wildlife and mining, as well as recreational resources and possible means of development. Johnson said population is shifting to the West and he has "high hopes" to development of the West highway program.

Johnson assured his constituents he will continue the fight for federal development of the power facilities on the Trinity River Project. He pledged support to fight for a \$350,000 transmission line for the Public Utility District. The item is in the federal budget but the Pacific Gas and Electric Company has offered to bring the power to the Shasta Dam area and Bureau of Reclamation officials have indicated to PUD directors the pro-private power Eisenhower administration has encouraged the PGE proposal.

Johnson said the fight for federal transmission line would be a major one but, he said, principles rather than money are at stake. He is opposed to any PGE tieup with the Bonneville Power Administration in Washington with Oregon and California and has asked the secretary of the interior to conduct a feasible study on the PGE proposal.

Congressman Johnson said new congressmen cannot "set the world on fire," but he means to watch appropriations and try to gain economies. He said it is just
