### Skiers Pass Frigid Night

LONGMIRE, Wash. (AP) — Three lost skiers who huddled in a snow cave, slapping each other to keep warm and singing to keep up spirits, survived a frigid night high on Mt. Rainier. Ulla Samvik, 31, Bo Ryfelt, 35, and Einer Storakers, 30, all of Seattle, had worked their way down to the 6,500-foot level before they were found Monday afternoon. They were hungry but unhurt.

Storakers, member of a mountain rescue team at Jamtland Fjall, Sweden, before coming to the United States two years ago, was credited with devising the survival shelter.

"We think his experience is what saved our lives," said Miss Samvik. "He showed us how to dig a cave with our skis in the snow, where we crawled in and spent the night."

The party became lost on a Sunday skiing trip.

### Steel Industry Requested To Freeze Prices For Term

NEW YORK (AP)—The United Steelworkers of America have proposed to the steel industry that it freeze its prices for the term of the next contract with the union to help "economic stability."

Even if the industry agreed to do so, the union says it would insist on higher wages and other benefits for its half-million members.

Industry spokesmen had no immediate formal reply to the union's proposal, made Monday night in a letter to 12 big steel

producing companies. Prompt rejection of the union's suggestion was expected. The union last week turned down an industry proposal that wages and other contract benefits be frozen for a one-year contract period.

U.S. Steel, the industry's leading producer, declined comment. A U.S. Steel spokesman said the company was waiting to see the text of the union proposal.

The industry's call for a one-year wage freeze and the union's

proposal for a price freeze are part of the sparring prior to negotiations on a new contract to replace the one that expires June 30.

The union's price freeze proposal was drawn up by the executive board after it affirmed Pres-

ident David J. McDonald's rejection of the industry's proposal that present contract benefits terms be continued for another year.

The union executive board also suggested that negotiations for a new contract begin May 4, instead of May 18 as now scheduled. The union's 170-member wage policy committee is scheduled this month to draft contract demands.
