

Brave, Yank Moundsmen Register Brilliant Victories

It's axiomatic that the New York Yankees and Milwaukee Braves never look more like champions than when Whitey Ford and Lew Burdette are throwing goose-eggs at the opposition.

And, it's equally true that nothing can make a major league team look worse than to have its pitching collapse.

Both propositions were demonstrated dramatically Wednesday night when the Yankees and Braves scored brilliant victories on the strength of their pitching and the Cincinnati Reds and Kansas City Athletics suffered humiliating defeats through inability to hold big early leads.

Ford, pitching perhaps the finest game of his career, limited the Washington Senators to seven hits and struck out 13 batters in a 1-0, 11-inning victory while Burdette, off to one of the fastest starts of his career, out-dueled Robin Roberts to defeat the Philadelphia Phillies, 2-0. The Yankees thus kept the pressure on the front-running Cleveland Indians in the American League race and the Braves kept their lead in the National League chase.

And what poor Mayo Smith of the Reds and Harry Craft of the Athletics would have given for just a tiny bit of that kind of pitching!

Smith sat back comfortably when his Reds scored six runs in the third inning and led, 7-0, at the end of five innings. Then he groaned in despair as the Pitts-

burgh Pirates rallied to tie with seven runs in the seventh and went on to win, 9-8, on a ninth-inning single by Rocky Nelson.

Craft was living it up like Casey Stengel when his Athletics ran up a 6-1 lead on the Chicago White Sox after two innings. But the White Sox ruined his night by rallying to lead, 8-6, after six innings and then left him crushed when they tallied 11 runs on eight walks, one hit batsman, three errors and one solitary single in the seventh frame for a 20-6 triumph.

The Indians walloped the Detroit Tigers, 10-1, for their eighth win in nine games and the Boston Red Sox beat the Baltimore Orioles, 8-4, in the other American League games. The San Francisco Giants downed the Los Angeles Dodgers, 6-3, in the other National League game.

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Bevos Clobber 1958 Champs; Boost Giants Toward Cellar

The Phoenix Giants, who had been expected to mop up the Pacific Coast League in 1959 with a minimum of effort, languished in seventh spot Thursday, still trying to figure out what happened.

The Giants absorbed their fifth defeat in seven starts this year Wednesday night, with Portland's heavy-hitting Beavers administering an 11-5 drubbing to last year's pennant winners.

The Giants are only a slim cut above the Salt Lake City Bees, who took possession of the cellar by blowing a 9-5 decision to the

Seattle Rainiers in 11 innings.

In other league action, the Vancouver Mounties shaded the surprising Sacramento Solons 3-2 and San Diego's Padres moved into a first-place tie with Sacramento by whitewashing Spokane's Indians, 5-0, on Bobby Locke's four-hitter.

The Beavers blasted out 19 hits off four Phoenix hurlers while Vic Lombardi and reliever Bobby Schwarzkoff held Phoenix to 10 hits. Lombardi gained credit for the victory, his second of the season.

Owen Friend and Jose Pagan both hit home runs for the Giants. The Solons, who were all alone at the top of the standings going into Wednesday night's game, had

a four-game victory skein snapped off by lefty Joe Hatten and two relievers, Gordy Sundin and Dick Fitzgerald. They combined talents for a seven-hitter, with Hatten getting credit for the victory.

Ron Hansen's bases-loaded single in the seventh won the game for the Mounties. The hit drove in Eddie Basinski and Charley White to make it 3-1 in favor of Vancouver. The Solons picked up their final run in the last of the seventh on Bob Perry's homer over the right field wall.

The Rainiers got their final four runs in the top of the 11th on five hits, including a run-scoring single by Bill Wright, the winning pitcher. Seattle got four runs in the fourth frame with a base hit, scoring the tallies on two errors, two walks and two hit batsmen.

Paul Pettit gave the Salt Lake club its first home run of the season with a two-run blast in the third inning.

Locke, in evening his record at 1-1, struck out seven Spokane batters and walked only three in working the full route.

The Padres got all the runs they needed in the second inning when they converted Rudy Regalado's double, Billy Hunter's triple and an error into two runs. They picked up singleton's in the fifth, sixth and eighth.
