## Yrekans Seek Funds For LL

YREKA—Contributions are being sought by officials of the Yreka Little League, which was recently organized for the 1959 season, to outfit at least 30 of the 120 boys who are listed as candidate players this year, according to Robert J. Orlund, a member of the ways and means committee.

Officers were elected at the 1959 organizational meeting for the Yreka Little League, with Charles Lawson to serve again as president; Bert Knowles, vice president; Lloyd Lacy, treasurer; and Mrs. Eugene Brown, secretary.

Others named on the ways and means committee with Orlund are Louis T. Choate, Eugene Bray, and William R. Thomas. Last year the Yreka teams had only 75 players, with the addition of 15 from Scott Valley who were in the league. This year, Fort Jones, who boasts a new regulation park, is fielding four teams in its own league. According to Lawson, the Valley residents contributed \$3,200 towards the park, as well as considerable labor.

Other business at the Booster meeting included the appointment of a committee to act on KU track coach Jim Inglesby's suggestion that a representative Klamath Basin track team, including boys from each of the Klamath County High Schools, be sent to the Portland AAU cinder meet on June 6.

Easton, who served as director of the Drake games from 1941 through 1947, said, "This is the greatest. Man, they have some great runners here, really great." Bishop allowed only one SHA hit after taking over with no outs in the first and fanned 11 Trojans over the seven inning route. Sacred Hearts' George Hurley was charged with the defeat, allowing five Jayvee hits walking six and striking out one. His teammates committed four errors.

Not satisfied with turning in a commendable mound chore, Bishop rapped a double and a single in three trips to lead the young Pels in the hit statistics.

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## Sacramento Grabs Half Game Margin Over PCL Contenders

The Sacramento Solons, who found victories extremely hard to come by a year ago, were in the heady air at the top of the Pacific Coast League standings all alone Friday.

The Solons, who shut out the Vancouver Mounties 3-0 on rookie Noel Mickelson's six-hitter Thursday night, had a half-game bulge on the Spokane Indians, who had to go 11 innings to defeat San Diego's Padres 3-1.

In other league action, the Salt Lake City Bees smothered Seattle 9-0 and the Phoenix Giants, last year's pennant winners, used a five-run first inning to conquer Portland's Beavers 6-3.

Mickelson, a right-hander who managed to win only nine games

in 33 decisions at Atlanta and Jacksonville in 1958, gave the Mounties only six hits. He fanned seven and walked three in besting Vancouver's Bud Watkins, who held Sacramento to five safeties.

The Solons picked up one run in the seventh, then made sure of the victory in the eighth when Mickelson and Buddy Peterson raced across home plate on a throwing error by Vancouver second baseman Marv Breeding.

The Indians and Padres went into the 11th frame knotted at 1-1 as Spokane's Connie Grob and Bud Podbielan hooked up in a dandy pitching duel.

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
