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Governor's Murderer Is Still Unnamed To Date

FRANKFORT, Ky. (UPI)—A rifle cracked. The frock-coated figure staggered and fell. Four days later, after being sworn in as governor of Kentucky, William Goebel died of a bullet that had pierced his body.

Who fired the fatal shot? Though these events took place 59 years ago, the identity of the assassin is still cloaked in mystery and doubt.

On Jan. 30, 1900, Goebel was walking to the Statehouse to attend a joint session of the Legislature which he confidently expected would upset the results of the 1899 election and declare him governor.

Three months before, Republican William S. Taylor had defeated Goebel of 2,383 votes in a bitterly-disputed gubernatorial election. Goebel charged fraud and contested the election in the Democratic-controlled Legislature where he sat as president pro-tem of the Senate.

An army of mountaineers flowed into Frankfort from eastern Kentucky when it seemed certain that Taylor would be unseated. For more than a week, groups of armed, rifle-toting mountain men roamed the capital's streets muttering threats at Democratic legislators.

Then came the fatal shot. Virtual anarchy followed as Goebel died after lingering four days in a room of the Capitol Hotel.

Secretary of State Caleb Powers, from whose office the shot was fired, was arrested by state troopers on a train bound for Louisville. The Legislature, barred from the Statehouse by troops, met at the hotel and named Goebel governor. On May 21, the Supreme Court upheld the action, and Governor Taylor fled to Indiana to escape prosecution for conspiracy.

Three men were tried and convicted, but all were pardoned by subsequent governors.

Powers was sentenced to hang at one of his four trials for conspiracy, but after his pardon he

served four terms in the U.S. House of Representatives from a Republican district in eastern Kentucky.

Henry Youtsey, a Statehouse clerk, and Jim Howard, a mountain feudist, were both convicted of the shooting. Both denied firing the shot, although Youtsey testified he pointed Goebel out to Howard and handed him a rifle.

In recent years, an elderly mountain woman has claimed she heard a man named Turner Igo confess the shooting at a family reunion in 1903. Igo was also accused in a deposition made by Taylor's secretary shortly after the shooting.

Dr. Bennett H. Wall, a University of Kentucky historian, recently uncovered another story told by an elderly mountain lawyer. He claimed a convict named Joe Adkins, who was released from the penitentiary a few weeks before the assassination, was hired to kill Goebel.

But nobody knows for certain who fired the shot.

FOREIGN AID

TOLEDO, Ohio (UPI)—Edgar T. Harris, an export parts packager in an automobile plant here, searched his home and the factory, then gave up hope of ever finding the wallet he had lost. Six months later, a package postmarked Chittagong, East Pakistan, arrived for Harris. It contained the missing wallet. The billfold had fallen from his pocket into a box of parts destined for shipment overseas.

PETTY LARCENY

HOUSTON, Tex. (UPI)—David Alexander, 6, complained that two young rowdies robbed him in broad daylight while he was on his way home from school—and then added insult to injury. "What makes me so mad," said David, was that "when they turned me loose, they went right across the street to a candy store and spent my whole six cents right there."

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
