Russians' Bolshoi Ballet Does Best Work In Classic

NEW YORK (AP)—The Bolshoi Ballet's "Giselle" in the Metropolitan Opera House Tuesday night proved again that this visiting company's finest work is done in the old-time classic numbers.

Seen already in a modern "Romeo and Juliet," a traditional "Swan Lake" and a highlights program composed largely of contemporary pieces, the Soviet company mimed and danced their "Giselle" beautifully. Even one bad tumble did not spoil a pas de deux as exquisite as you can hope to see.

Youths Held For Shooting

RICHMOND, Va. (AP) — Three more white youths have been charged in the Sunday night shooting of six Negro boys in Richmond's East End.

Cecil Payne Deane, 17, and Raymond Gay Lumpkin, 19, were released under bonds of \$5,000 each for May 12 hearings in Juvenile and Domestic Relations Court. They were charged Tuesday on six counts of malicious wounding.

In a hearing before Judge Kermit V. Rooke bond for Robert Jerald Kenney, 17, was raised from \$2,500 to \$5,000. Kenney was charged Monday with felonious assault.

Bonds of \$2,500 each have been set for five others charged with being accessories before and after the fact.

Late Tuesday night Richmond police served six warrants charging felonious and malicious wounding on an unidentified 16-year-old Richmonder who gave himself up to Norfolk County police.

The youngest admitted being with the other youths Sunday but denied knowledge of their plans or that anyone had been hurt.
