

Solon, Padre Duel Threatening In PCL

The Sacramento Solons, with their superb pitching, and the solidly balanced San Diego Padres are threatening to make the run for the Pacific Coast League pennant strictly a two-way race.

Both clubs have left the other six teams in a cloud of springtime dust. The Solons have captured 11 of their first 15 contests while the Padres have grabbed 10 of 15 decisions. Not another team is playing over .500 ball.

Sacramento won Wednesday night in what has become typical fashion. Solon Chuck Hickman tossed a four-hitter at Portland as his teammates coasted home, 7-1.

San Diego, on the strength of a dramatic three run homer by Rudy Regalado in the last of the ninth, clipped Seattle, 3-2. Other action saw Phoenix belt last-place Vancouver, 7-3, while Spokane and Salt Lake split a doubleheader.

The Indians salvaged the nightcap 1-0, after dropping the opener, 4-0.

MALIN—Randy Miller of Malin and Merrill's Denny Salvadori locked horns in a tight pitching duel here Wednesday afternoon as the hosting Mustangs edged out a 2-0 victory, scoring the only pair of runs during the contest in the sixth inning without the benefit of a base hit.

Miller and Salvadori, both right-handers, turned in sparkling performances. Miller yielded three hits, all singles and struck out three while giving up no bases on balls. Salvadori, who was reached for four Malin hits, whiffed six and walked three in his seven-inning stint.

Coach Al Keck's Huskies committed two of their three errors for the game in the fateful sixth, coupled with a pair of walks. Salvadori retired the first two batters to face him but the trouble began when big Ron Mullanix and Ed Stasny drew consecutive bases on balls. Mullanix scored when Don Johnson was safe on an error and Stasny did likewise when Don Long was safe on Bill Artery's miscue at shortstop.

Anglers Eye Good Weekend

Rain, snow, and wind, seasoned liberally with sleet and gusty squalls was the undetectable menu dished out by the fickle weatherman to hordes of anglers who jammed the lowland lakes and the stream systems of the state April 25 and 26 for the opening weekend of Oregon's general trout season.

Despite the dampened camps, clothes, and spirits, anglers who toughed out the weather found the fishing good to excellent in most parts of the state, with rainbow trout, browns, and kokanee cooperating in fine fashion.

Crescent Lake was poor with heavy winds, rain, and snow making angling almost impossible except for a few hours Saturday morning. Odell Lake was good Saturday morning with kokanee trout running to 16 inches. A few large rainbow and lake trout were brought to creel. Heavy winds and rain buffeted anglers in the afternoon and all day Sunday.

Klamath Basin anglers had a field day Saturday with big fish the rule but found the going rough Sunday as storms hit the area. Lake of the Woods produced excellent results with rainbow running to 16 inches. Upper Klamath was a

scorching hot on rainbows from 12 to 20 inches. The Sycan River was another hot spot with many rainbows and browns going to 24 inches. The Sprague was excellent but muddied up late Saturday afternoon. The small tributaries throughout the valley produced excellent catches of smaller fish. According to reports received, the best luck on the Sycan went to anglers using worms, while small hatchling or spinners behind trails figure the best bet on both Odell and Crescent.

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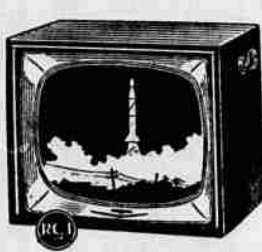
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
