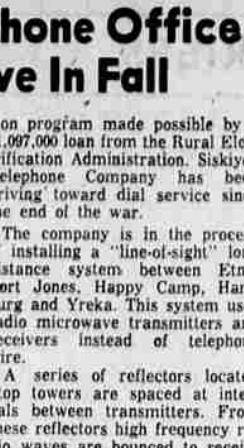

Patient Flees SF Hospital

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) - An intensive police search was ordered here today for a "dangerous" mental patient who Monday escaped from a bailiff at the Hall of Justice as he was being taken to his jail cell. Chief Thomas Cahill ordered the all-out effort after he learned the escapee, Landrow Taylor, 36, had a long record of assault arrests in New York, Pennsylvania and Michigan. It was also discovered that Taylor, a self-styled artist, escaped a year ago from a veterans hospital in Battle Creek, Mich., where he had been transferred from a state mental institution.

Moonlighting Ruled Legal

PORTLAND (AP) - Atty. Gen. Robert V. Thornton has ruled that the practice of moonlighting is not forbidden by the state constitution. Moonlighting is taking a second job, usually a part time one. Labor leaders recently have objected to county and city workers holding two jobs while many others persons are out of work. Thornton's ruling was provided in response to a question by Sen. William A. Grenfell Jr. (D-Portland). Last week Multnomah County Dep. Dist. Atty. Willis A. West said that state law forbids county employees from taking outside work. West said Thornton's ruling was not in conflict with his finding. He said Thornton's opinion did not explore the state law which West cited in his opinion.

State Division Of Highways Makes Changes In Freeway

DUNSMUIR-In construction of the new freeway between Dunsuir and Redding, plans of the State Division of Highways made two short river channel changes necessary at Sims, 13 miles south of Dunsuir, and at Castle Crags, four miles south of Dunsuir. Studies by both the Division of Highways and Southern Pacific developed that a joint project including relocation of the railroad could be entered into with greater benefits to both parties than engaging in separate projects. Therefore under an agreement between the railroad and the state, Southern Pacific will arrange to move the channel and do the necessary grading for the railroad roadbed and the river channel. Work is to start Monday and Morrison Knutson Construction Company has been awarded the contract. They are establishing headquarters in Dunsuir. The work should take about four months before the new portion of the railroad will be in use. Freeway roadbed grading by the division of highways will be subject to relocation of the river channel. At present the railroad crosses the Sacramento River twice at Sims and twice at Castle Crags with the river between the railroad and the highway. After construction the new freeway will be about 100 feet above the railroad and both will be on the same side of the river. The Castle Crag project involves relocation of about 1,500 feet of river channel eastward and another 1,500 feet westward at the opposite end of the change. In other words, a bow in the river will be eliminated and this straightening of the river will eliminate high water dangers to the railroad and the freeway during the heavy spring runoff. Engineers estimate that 120,000 cubic yards of material will be needed to straighten the channel at these two points.

Battle Lines Finalized As Milk Price War Looming

That was the opinion today of Assemblyman Carl A. Britschgi (R-Redwood City), a dairyman and milk distributor himself until recently. Britschgi said the fight is over position came from Republican legislators. Much of the impact of cross-filing was reduced by a measure approved by the voters in 1952 which provided that party labels would appear on the ballot after the name of each candidate. That measure was put on the ballot to offset an initiative to repeal cross-filing. Sponsored by the Democrats, the cross-filing repealer failed in 1952 by a margin of less than 4,000 votes. However, the addition of party labels on the ballot resulted in fewer candidates winning both party nominations in the primary. Other developments: Bills: Monday was the final day for introducing bills without suspending the Constitution. A tally showed a total of 3,364 measures introduced in the Assembly and 1,710 in the Senate for a grand total of 5,074 since the session started last January. Milk: Assemblyman Carl A. Britschgi (R-Redwood City) introduced a highly controversial bill to repeal the minimum retail and wholesale prices for milk. Under his proposal, the producer still would have his price set by state law but other prices would be unregulated. Labor: Brown's program for great labor gains in the field of unemployment and disability insurance benefits and workmen's compensation made progress in an Assembly committee. The major bill approved by Finance and Insurance would boost the maximum unemployment insurance payments from \$40 to \$55 a week. Development: The Senate voted 30-2 in favor of an administration bill to create an economic development agency to encourage new business to come to California.
