

Rise To Power Explanation Given By Baltimore Mayor

BALTIMORE (AP) — Democrat J. Harold Grady offered a modest explanation today for his rocketing from political obscurity to mayor of Baltimore in a few short months.

"You can't attribute this to any political organization," he said after Tuesday night's thumping victory over Republican Theodore R. McKeldin, former mayor and governor of Maryland.

"It just showed the people are turning away the old faces," Grady suggested.

McKeldin is the second old face turned away by Baltimoreans in favor of Grady this year. The 42-year-old lawyer and former FBI agent, elected to a four-year term as state's attorney only last

November, defeated three-time Mayor D'Alesandro in the March 3 Democratic primary.

Until then Grady's only political experience had been as an unopposed 1958 candidate for the prosecutor's job to which he had been appointed a short time earlier. His predecessor had been named to a judgeship in mid-term, and the professional politicians decided to give the young, ruggedly handsome Grady a free ride.

He decided to run for mayor after D'Alesandro failed to win election to the U.S. Senate in November and then announced he would seek a fourth term in City Hall.

Returns from 567 of 572 polling places gave Grady 144,025 votes, McKeldin 71,981. Democrats also won seats for comptroller, City Council president and all 20 places on the Council, which they had held before.

The turnout was a shade over 50 per cent of the registered voters, among whom Democrats outnumbered Republicans nearly 4-1.

McKeldin, whose reputation as an orator had led to his selection as the principal nominating speaker for Eisenhower in the 1952 Republican National Convention, had successfully overcome this registration disadvantage three times. He was elected mayor in 1943 and governor in 1950 and 1954, the only member of his party to spend two terms in the governor's mansion.

Now 58 and blocked from a third-term bid by the state Constitution, he had sought to prolong a once-brilliant career by becoming the first man to have served as mayor, governor and mayor again.

But this time there were no major Democratic organizations openly in his corner from the start, as there had been in his successful races. It was more like the lonely years in which he lost for mayor, 1939, and for governor, 1942 and 1946.

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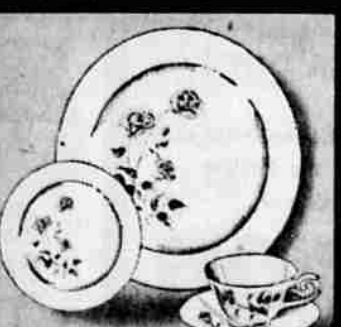
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
