### Restaurant Changes Hands; Now Under New Ownership

**BLY**—The Bly Halfway House, local hotel, restaurant and lounge, is now open after a closure of several months because of remodeling and change of owners.

The new owners of the establishment are Mrs. Helen Brink and her partner, Larry Wolter. Mrs. Brink and Wolter own The Pines Tavern in Klamath Falls. The property was purchased from the estate of the late Rollo (Pop) England early in April.

The hotel has 17 rooms but no No. 13. It has a small lobby upstairs. The dining room is quite spacious, and can accommodate large groups at a time. The family atmosphere in the dining room affords a pleasant surrounding for the family outing.

A banquet room will be remodeled in the near future to accommodate the private parties and club groups who need a large meeting place.

Mr. and Mrs. Kenny Ward are managing the restaurant division of the establishment.

The Halfway House was built in 1928 by a Mr. Schaeffer who at that time ran the Billiards establishment in Klamath Falls. It has changed hands several times. A few of the owners in the past were Jack House, Daymond Savage, Mr.

Pellin. In 1936 to 1953 it was run by Mr. and Mrs. Monte Cline who in turn sold it to the Thrasher Brothers who ran it for a short

while when a fire damaged the building. The Thrashers in turn sold it to Pop England and Mr. Davig. England bought Davig's in-

terest out the following year and operated it until his death in 1957. It was then leased to Louis Wren before this final transaction.
