

Logging Town Now Finished

PONDOSA, Ore. (AP)—This little Eastern Oregon logging community is no more.

It was sold lock, stock and lot to an auctioneer Tuesday.

The town, and mill, owned by the Valselt Lumber Co., was abandoned last March because of a shortage of timber in the area.

Bids at Tuesday's sale ranged from 25 cents for mill parts to \$27,000 for a diesel locomotive. The engine was bought by Schnitzer & Wolf of Portland for \$27,000.

Rex Roberts, Roseburg machinery dealer, bought most of the land and about half of the 33 houses. He paid \$250 each for the houses and \$7,750 for 240 of the 280 acres of land which included the hotel, store, office, post office and store building, the saw mill and the planing mill.

He said he has no definite plans for the houses. But he added that he did not intend to buy them for a housing development.

Time was allowed for a purchaser to buy the entire tract for 5 per cent above individual bids. But no offer was made. There had been talk before the sale that the town might be bought intact as a retirement city.

Blonde From Shelter Rock Sticks To Island Fortress

MINEOLA, N.Y. (UPI)—The besieged blonde of Shelter Rock Road stuck to her \$150,000 Long Island fortress today while her husband went to court for a divorce.

Mrs. Isabella Whelan, 39, wife of the nephew of the Whelan drug chain founder, said she didn't dare leave the 20-room mansion with 55-foot swimming pool, lest private detectives hired by her husband bar her return.

Both Mrs. Whelan and the 56-year-old oil company owner have charged adultery in counter-divorce suits. The case was to be heard by Mineola Supreme Court Justice Howard Hogan, who noted it already had been postponed 13 times.

Mrs. Whelan's greatest worry was some maneuver to get her off the estate, held jointly in her name, where she has held out since Easter after breaking in with a hammer and surviving a squeeze on food deliveries.

Mrs. Whelan charged that

guards of the Lavery Detective Agency, patrolling the grounds on Whelan's orders, had cut off life's necessities for herself and their son, Brian, 9, until kindly newspapermen began doing her grocery shopping.

The slender, tanned Mrs. Whelan telegraphed Gov. Nelson Rockefeller Tuesday, asking that "justice be done." There was no response from the governor, who leaves today for South America.

"I can't go on like this," she said. "I feel like someone who finds himself behind bars yelling 'They can't do this to me'—but they are."

Seldom has an estranged wife suffered in such luxury. The sprawling white house is on a nine-acre estate flowering with fruit trees, a cabana at poolside and a doll house almost as big as the split-level ranch homes nearby.

No one is permitted by the detectives to enter the house except the son, Brian, who goes daily to a nearby school. At the chained front gate is a direct phone to send the flash to Whelan the moment Mrs. Whelan abandons her entrenched position.
