PORTLAND (AP) — Union pile drivers threatened today to extend their strike but a feared general tie-up of the construction industry in Oregon and southwest Washington did not result.

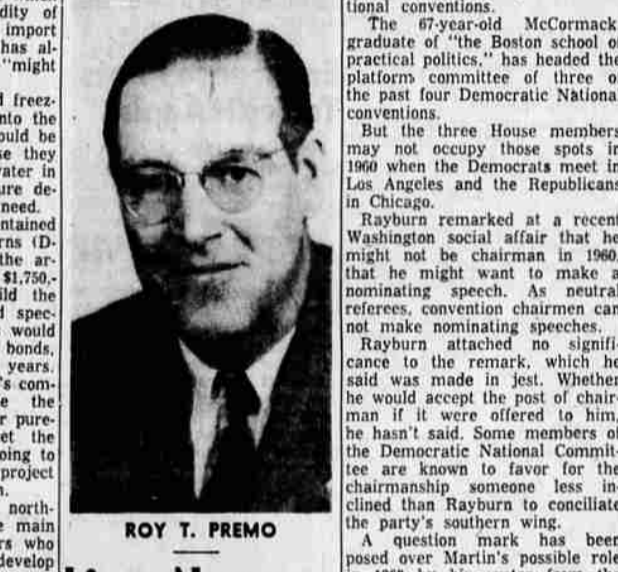
