Two Klamath Falls Co-eds To Attend 'Girls State'

Ann Jendrzejewski, a junior at Sacred Heart Academy, and Linda Sweatt, a junior at Klamath Union High School, recently were selected by students and teachers of the two schools to attend Girls State at Willamette University in Salem June 15 through 21.

Miss Jendrzejewski is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Walt Jendrzejewski. Miss Sweatt is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James R. Sweatt. All are of Klamath Falls.

Girls State is sponsored by the American Legion Auxiliary. About 250 girls selected from schools in Oregon gather to govern a mythical state.

The program is designed to teach principles of government. Girls choose city, county and state "officials." They introduce, debate and vote on bills in a model legislative session.

And they conduct court sessions and "govern" their respective home towns and counties.

Two girls from the Oregon group will be chosen to represent the state in Girls Nation held each year in Washington, D.C.

Miss Jendrzejewski's trip is sponsored and underwritten by the Catholic Daughters of America. The Klamath Falls American Legion Auxiliary is sponsoring Miss Sweatt's trip. Both girls will leave by bus June 15.

Relief Aid To Be Taken

Famine and relief offerings will be taken on the Sabbath, May 9, in the Seventh Day Adventist Church. Mrs. Harry Morgan, president of the Dorcas welfare group of the local church has reported that under the famine and relief program, 20 local families had been helped with food, clothing and bedding, during the first quarter of the year and a total of 361 hours of work had been donated by welfare workers. A shipment of clothes was also sent overseas during that period.

Welfare aid from SDA churches is world wide. The church teaches that to clothe and feed the needy, to comfort the afflicted, and to point the weary and sin-sick soul to Jesus is the mission and the privilege of every child of God.

Contributions to the world wide work are made not only by Seventh Day Adventists but by many others who contribute material gifts and cash to the Disaster and Famine Relief Fund of the General Conference.

Via the 1957 offering, 24 countries received aid: 569,038 pounds of clothing were distributed; 11,000 Care packages went out; 2,524,269 pounds of food were offered, totaling \$736,010.

Last year an average of one Klamath Falls area child per month entered the Shrine hospital for treatment.

Hospital load is heavy. There is presently an average of 163 children awaiting admission from Oregon, Washington, Idaho, British Columbia and Alaska — the area the hospital serves.

The Klamath Falls Shrine Club sponsors its dance annually to help provide the hospital with operating capital.

About \$355,000 will be needed above expected miscellaneous donations to keep the 80-bed unit operating.

The hospital has maintained full-capacity operation since 1924.

The fund is growing from bequests from wills, direct donations and any surpluses the hospital funnel into it. The land is nine million dollars short of the goal.

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
