GIFTS OF CHINA

NEW YORK (UPI)—Fine china should be translucent, resonant when tapped with a pencil, lightweight and well-balanced, with even edges. Its color should not be streaked or mottled. A glaze adds a protective coating to the china and also is the most sanitary surface of all dinnerware.
