

Nine Hornets Ready For District Meet

Nine Henley trackmen and coach Ted Ammerman leave early Friday morning for Ashland where the Hornets enter the District 6 A-2 track meet which will wind up on Saturday afternoon. The first two finishers in each event will enter the state meet the following weekend at the University of Oregon.

Representing Klamath County in the district meet on the Ashland oval will be Burrell Gober in the high jump and both hurdle events. Floyd Kendall in the mile, Phil Swisher in both the shot put and discus, Don Mills in the high jump, Chuck Bloisly in the broad jump and Cliff Long in the high jump, 440 and 880.

The combined team of Dave Ragland, Calvin Casebier, Gary Pippin and Bloisly will make up the Henley relay team which placed third in the sub-district meet held last weekend, in Ashland.

'B' Aces To Enter State Test

Malin with seven entrants and Merrill with five lead a group of County B League track squad members into the State B meet which will be held at Springfield Friday and Saturday. Bonanza is next in line with four entrants while Chilcoquin has two and Bly one. Leading Coach Al Keck's charges from Merrill are Don Russell in the 100-yard dash and 440, Bud Maupin and Bill Beasley in the 220, Dick Marks in the 120-yard high hurdles and Charles Rolier in the 180-yard low hurdles. The relay team, which grabbed first place honors in last weekend's district meet on Modoc Field, will be composed of Russell, Beasley, Rolier, and Maupin. In the district meet, Russell snared two firsts, the 100 and 440, while Maupin was first in the 220 and Beasley third, ranking him as an alternate.

Ammerman's squad grabbed three first places in that meet, Gober winning the high jump, Kendall the mile event and Swisher the discus.

Gober, in winning the high jump with a leap of 5 feet, 6 1/2 inches, was far short of his record-breaking leap of 5-11, which he set in the county meet two weeks ago. The springy-legged senior has almost completely recovered from an ankle sprain that he suffered near the end of the basketball season which has hampered his performances for the Hornet track team.

Swisher was also far short of his top effort of 133 feet, 10 inches in the discus event, which came in a dual meet with the KU Jayvees earlier in the season. At Ashland last week, Swisher tossed the platter 118 feet, 6 inches for top honors while placing second in the shot put.

Kendall's time of 5:01 in the mile was his best effort of the year. He has won most of the dual meets in that event in the county this past spring. However, he suffered his initial defeat in the Klamath Falls Invitational when outlasted by Chilcoquin's Doug Van Warner.

Other Huskies entering the state meet will be Rolier who copped the low hurdles event and Marks, who was second in the high hurdles.

Malin's traveling squad will be composed of first place winner Rick Illian in the pole vault, third place winners Ron Mullanix and Dave DeMerritt in the shot put and discus and 880 and high hurdles respectively while the Mustang relay squad, which finished third at district, will be made up of Stan Petrusek, Abe Kirkpatrick, Don Micka and Burt McCollough. First place finishers Gary Dayley in the broad jump and Alvin Brooks in the pole vault lead the Bonanza Antlers to the state meet while the remainder of the squad is composed of third place winners Tom Ellis in the javelin and Jim O'Cooner in the low hurdles.
