Missile Base Building Set

MOSES LAKE, Wash. (AP) - A \$46,000,000 intercontinental missile base will be built near here by the Air Force, Sen. Henry M. Jackson (D-Wash.) told civic and business leaders Monday.
Site of the installation is tentatively located about 18 miles southeast of Moses Lake near Warden, Jackson said.

Authorizing legislation for the base, to be equipped with Titan missiles, now is before Congress, the Senator said, and should be acted on by armed services subcommittee within a week.
The base here is expected to be similar to the one announced recently for Idaho's Mountain Home Air Force Base.

The Titan ICBMs would be located in underground, steel-lined, concrete bunkers, each of them about 60 feet deep and between 30 and 40 feet in diameter. Launching bases would be spread over a 30-mile area.
Larson AFB near here would house support facilities for the missile base, Larson recently was placed under the Strategic Air Command.

Aide Blasts Race Laws

SEATTLE (AP) - Racial discrimination in housing in certain Washington state areas was likened by a civil rights group Monday to those prevailing in the deep South.

A report by Sam W. Tarshis, vice chairman of the Washington Advisory Committee to the U. S. Commission on Civil Rights, said conditions for Negroes ranged from "relatively good" in the Seattle area to "near-servitude" in Tri-City and vicinity.

"In Pasco and Kennewick, rigid bars against Negroes reminiscent of those which prevail in the deep southern tier of states seem to be the norm," the report said.
Negroes are deprived of decent housing, including apartments and of the opportunity to utilize recreational facilities by "various stratagems and practices."

The committee is headed by former Seattle Mayor William F. Devin. It is a fact-finding body that reports to the national group.
The report noted that four Seattle residential districts - Broadmoor, The Highlands, the Sand Point Country Club and Windermere - have traditionally been barred to Jews.
Housing for Negroes in Spokane and Tacoma also were labeled as unfavorable and the report described conditions in Pasco as "ghetto-like."
