

# Rebellion In Lama Land Apparently Snuffed Out

NEW DELHI (AP)—The rebellion in Tibet appears to be dying. It may already be dead.

Reports reaching the border towns of Kailompong and Gangtok indicate the uprising of Khampa tribesmen, which flared fiercely late in March and early April, has been snuffed out by the superior guns of Red Chinese occupation forces.

## 'Mastermind' Group Asked

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The State Department wants to set up a "brain trust" whose sole duty would be to master-mind global political and economic warfare against the Communists.

The plan was disclosed today when a House appropriations subcommittee made public testimony given last February by State Department officials.

Undersecretary of State C. Douglas Dillon, Deputy Undersecretary Loy W. Henderson and others warned that the Communist offensive had picked up to such an extent that the United States had to move fast to counteract it.

They urged that Congress provide enough money to create a special staff that would devote full-time to analyzing the Red moves and how to combat them.

The plan drew a cool reaction from subcommittee Chairman John Rooney (D-N.Y.) who said he thought the State Department had been doing just that for the past 15 years.

Henderson said the State Department has "long felt it was not organized in a way which would enable it quickly to ascertain what the various columns of international Communism were trying to do everywhere to take steps to thwart their efforts."

"We feel the time has come in view of the growing aggressiveness of international Communism in the economic field that we should have a global approach," he declared.

Dillon warned it has become "perfectly clear" the Russians are now making major use of economic weapons "to bring the world under Communist domination."

Refugees straggling out of the Himalayan land of the lamas picture it as held firmly under the heel of Chinese overlords determined to prove they can rule without public approval — and without the Dalai Lama if need be.

Refugees say the main reason the revolt failed was lack of weapons. The handmade rifles and clubs of the Khampas proved no match for Chinese artillery and machine guns.

Reports published in New Delhi say that nearly half the 10,000 refugees who have flocked into India and the border states of Sikkim and Bhutan are Khampas. Many are believed to have been wounded as they fled.

Gyangtse, where the rebels were strong enough six weeks ago to march away the Chinese commissar at gunpoint, now lies quiet and subdued under Chinese guns. One arrival from there said the huge monastery was under Red guard and that pilgrims had to get clearance from Red troops.

Many rich Gyangtse merchants were reported in prison. On May 10, local youths were forced to shout Red Chinese slogans and chant "we want reforms," the witness said.

Indian observers, who emphasize there is no way of checking the refugee reports, believe the Chinese are making an all-out attempt to put down the rebellion as proof they can do without the Dalai Lama, god-king of the Tibetans who has taken refuge in India.

The Chinese apparently feel such a demonstration might make the Dalai Lama more willing to return under Red terms. As long as the young titular ruler remains in India, he is a potential rallying point.

## Cleric Named As Suspect

POPLARVILLE, Miss. (UPI)—A 58-year-old white Baptist minister said today the FBI told him several persons have named him as the prime suspect in the lynching of a Negro alleged rapist.

The Rev. James Lee, pastor of a rural Baptist church north of here, told United Press International the FBI told him several persons have identified him as "the number one suspect" in the kidnaping of 23-year-old Mack Charles Parker.

Parker was forcibly taken from his jail cell here April 25. He was waiting trial on a charge of raping a white woman. His body, pierced by two bullets, was found floating in the Pearl River May 4.

One of the minister's eight sons, garage mechanic Jeff Lee, and farmer C. C. (Crip) Beever, both of Poplarville, said the FBI has questioned them at length about the hooded mob that abducted Parker. They said the federal agents have also had them under surveillance.
