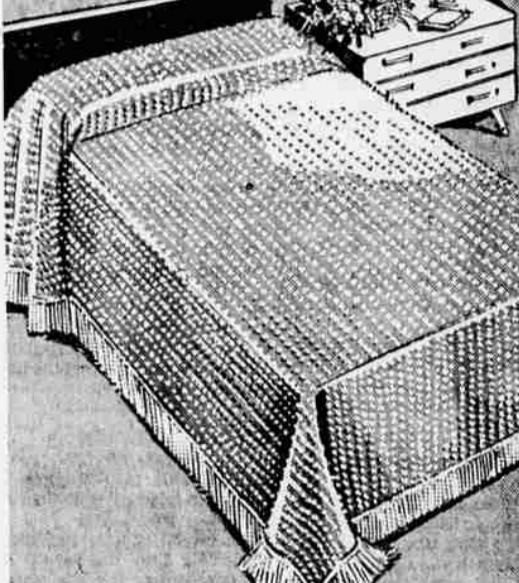

### Alien Exhibit To Be Seen

PORTLAND (AP)—The Oregon Centennial Commission Monday received its first major foreign exhibit for this summer's centennial exposition.

It is a 61-ton wood-burning locomotive, the gift of the Finnish government.

In other action Monday, the commission:

Decided to freeze some \$85,000 in funds which it has on hand until exposition revenues start rolling in.

Heard that Wayne Dillard, producer of exposition shows, is attempting to book either the Lawrence Welk show or the Russian Folk Dancers.

Approved the proposal of the Pinkerton National Detective Agency to furnish guards at the exposition at a cost of \$1.95 an hour.
