### Chief May Be On Spot With Legislation Plea

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower may have put not only the Democratic Congress but himself on a political spot with his demand for speedy action on highway, housing and wheat legislation. A similar reaction came from House Democratic leaders.  
Mansfield said, for instance, there is no possibility that Congress will even consider increasing the gasoline tax from 3 to 4 cents a gallon. Eisenhower had asked the increase to finance additional grants to the states for construction of interstate highways.  
There is no dispute in Congress over Eisenhower's request for additional loan insurance authority for the Federal Housing Administration. But both the Senate and a House committee have included this in general housing bills which contain features to which Eisenhower objects, Mansfield said. The housing bills will not be pared down to the limits the President wants.  
The House Agriculture Committee answered Eisenhower's plea for lower wheat supports by voting Wednesday to maintain these price props at 90 per cent of parity for the next two years, instead of the 75 per cent reduction in wheat acreage allotments.  
There were strong indications, however, that neither the house nor the senate would accept the committee bill in its present form.

### House Vetoes Ike Request

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower's request for 260 million dollars to build a new super aircraft carrier reportedly has been turned down by a House Appropriation subcommittee.

Instead, the 17-man group has decided, the money should be spent to beef up antisubmarine and missile programs and to maintain stronger reserve and National Guard forces.  
The subcommittee has agreed to almost the exact amount asked by the President — \$40,000,000 — in new appropriations for the Defense Department for the year starting July 1.  
"The amount of new money won't vary substantially from what the President requested," a member disclosed. "The only disagreement between us and the President is how it should be spent."  
The subcommittee's recommendations are subject to review by the entire 50-member committee later this month.
