SNOW MEASURE SHOWS DECLINE

ETNA—A comparison between snowfalls of a year ago and the past season is evidenced by the difference of snow depths between May 1 this year and that of a year ago. The most recent snow survey by USFS personnel from Callahan, measured in three courses in the Boulder Lake region shows at Dynamite Meadows, elevation 5,700 feet, May 1 this year snow depth none and water content none; in 1958, on May 1, snow depth measured 46.2 inches; with water content 19.8 inches; average May 1 snow depth 25.9 and water content 11.3.
