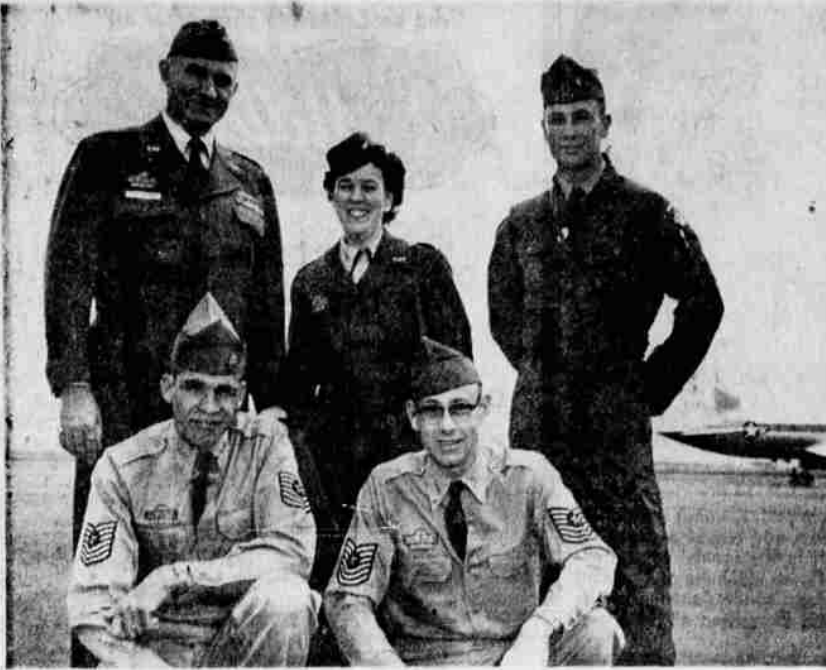

Bonneville Power Revision Requested By Neuberger

WASHINGTON (AP)—Reorganization of the Bonneville Power Administration to give it responsibility for supplying wholesale power needs of its contract customers was proposed Wednesday by Sen. Richard L. Neuberger (D-Ore).

He added the provision to a revised version of his bill to empower the agency to finance new electric facilities in the Pacific Northwest states.

In offering the revised bill to the Senate, Neuberger said in a prepared speech that the provision, which he designated as the "public utility responsibility clause," would be a departure from present policy.

"Always before federal power systems have operated on the basis of dividing up the scarcity of power, of allocating the inadequate available supply to consumers

and public agencies under the public preference clause," Neuberger said.

"As long as there is no shortage of power, the preference clause has no effect, and under this section it is the responsibility of the corporation to assure that no condition of shortage is permitted to develop."

As a result, Neuberger said, "economic growth of the Northwest need never again be held up by the inability of Bonneville to supply power to industry."

The new bill also contains what Neuberger described as a "very mild and gentle modification" of the public power preference clause. This provision, which has been criticized by public power groups, would require Bonneville to distribute electric power equitably throughout Pacific Northwest states "so that there will be no

He is the son of Mrs. Eldred Hansen of 2530 Reclamation Avenue, Klamath Falls.

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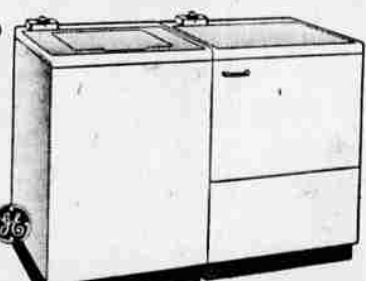
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
