Solutions In Air Crashes May Be Unsolved For While

BALTIMORE, Md. (AP)—It will be weeks, possibly months, before the public knows the causes of two airliner accidents — 300 miles and 38 minutes apart — that claimed 33 lives. Both involved Capital Airlines planes bound for Atlanta.

A mysterious explosion ripped apart a turboprop Viscount high over Maryland, hurling all 31 aboard to their deaths. The tragedy occurred at 5:18 p.m. Tuesday 15 miles east of Baltimore when the air was turbulent from a thundersquall.

Just 38 minutes earlier, a giant Constellation landing at Charleston, W.Va., toppled over the end of a runway and burst into flames, killing two of the 44 persons aboard.

Ruling Given On Birth Date

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP)—Someday the daughter of the Edward L. Fosssett may ask for birthday parties on both May 11 and 12.

The clock in a Lexington hospital showed 12:25 a.m. last Tuesday when the baby was born.

But in view of Kentucky's varying time zones Fosssett, an assistant attorney general, asked the opinion of a colleague.

The reply: Lexington is on Daylight Saving Time but state law prohibits the official use of any other time than Standard. So the child was born Monday night—at least officially.

University To Name Chief

FOREST GROVE, Ore. (AP)—Dr. Miller A. F. Ritchie, president of Hartwick College at Oneonta, N.Y., will be the next president of Pacific University.

He will replace Charles J. Armstrong, who quit last fall to take a similar position at the University of Nevada.

Ritchie's appointment was announced Monday by the chairman of the board of trustees of Pacific. State Supreme Court justice George Rossman.

Rossman said Ritchie was qualified by his "outstanding success" as president of Hartwick since 1953; and his grasp of administrative and financial problems of private non-tax-supported institutions such as Pacific.

In Ritchie's five years at Hartwick, Rossman said, the building program expanded and endowment funds received large additions.

Ritchie is married and has three children. He is a graduate of Roanoke College in Virginia and also earned degrees at William and Mary and New York University.

Award Given Red Suspect

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP)—Clinton Jencks, 40-year-old former mine union official once accused of being a Communist, has been awarded a fellowship at the University of California.

The university said Wednesday he had been accorded the Woodrow Wilson Fellowship Foundation Award and plans to start work next fall on a master's degree in economics.

Jencks' Mine, Mill and Smelters Workers Union card was taken away by the CIO 10 years ago after it labeled him a Communist. He was sentenced to a five-year term on perjury charges six years ago, but was granted a new trial by the U.S. Supreme Court. The government decided against a retrial.

Foundation officials said they had found no evidence Jencks is a Communist or ever was one.

Naval Leader Raps Defense

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The commander of the First Pacific Fleet says America's defense against missile-launching submarines "is not as good as I would like to see it."

Russian subs probably are deployed along the Pacific coast, Vice Admiral Ruthven E. Libby told a news conference Wednesday. But he would not confirm reports the subs have been sighted near the Channel Islands off the Southern California coast.

"Our needs to combat this threat are more efficiency and more ships," he added. "We are getting fewer ships, and the ones we have are 14 years old and wearing out."

Huge Land-Lease Profit Told By U.S. Investigators

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Government investigators reported today that some New Mexico and Colorado farmers have leased state land for 25 cents an acre and then rented it to the federal soil bank program for \$7 to \$9.

The report by General Accounting Office (GAO) investigators was made to a House agricultural appropriations subcommittee.

The GAO agents said they found 12 cases in Curry County, N. M., where land leased from the state had been placed in the soil bank conservation reserve. In one case, they said, "about 550 acres leased for 25 cents an acre was placed in the reserve at an annual rental rate of \$9 an acre."

Agriculture department officials told the investigators the procedure is legal. They said that if a farmer holds a valid lease on state-owned land and if the land has actually been used for producing crops, it is eligible for conservation reserve contracts on the same basis as privately owned land.

Under the conservation reserve, the government pays farmers at a national average rental rate of \$13.50 an acre to keep cropland idle under three-to-10 year contracts. The program is aimed at reducing production of surplus crops.

In addition to the rental payments, farmers entering the program can get federal checks to help cover the cost of putting grass or other conservation crops on the land.

In Colorado, the GAO investigators said, agriculture department records showed that 49 farm operators in 16 counties had 8,541 acres of state-owned land in the conservation reserve last April 1.
