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Increase In Timber From National Forests Sought

Sen. Richard L. Neuberger of Oregon announced recently two Senate committees will start work immediately on means for implementing a proposed long-range development and management program designed to treble the harvest of National Forest timber by the year 2000.

"Because of Oregon's dominance as a lumber producing state, the program has greater potential impact on our economic future than any governmental proposal since establishment of the National Forests in 1905," the Oregon Senator told a luncheon meeting of Western Forest Industries Association at the Multnomah Hotel. "It forecasts an era of growth and stability for the forest products industry."

The development program for the National Forests, presented to Congress prior to the Easter recess, calls for intensified efforts to provide more timber, water, recreation, wildlife and other renewable resources from the National Forests so as to meet anticipated requirements of the nation's expanded population by the year 2000, Neuberger explained.

Neuberger recalled that recommendation for a long-range forestry management plan to meet future goals was "the major proposal contained in the Senate Interior Committee staff study which I requested last year."

"Prompt response by the Secretary of Agriculture to that recommendation indicates the widespread concern over future forestry management plans," he added.

The Senate Interior Committee, of which Neuberger is a member, and the Senate Agriculture Committee have joint jurisdiction over working out details of the forestry program outlined in a special Presidential message to Congress. Neuberger said he looked forward to participation in Committee consideration of the program.

Neuberger reported that the long-range program included:

1. Increasing annual harvest in the National Forests to 21.1 billion board-feet of sawtimber by the year 2000, on a sustained-yield basis, or about three times the 1957 cut.

2. Improved watershed management to stabilize soil, preserve water quality, and increase quantities.

3. Reseeding and better management of rangeland, including adjustment of grazing capacity, to achieve high-level production of forage.

4. Accelerated expenditures for recreation facilities to meet a use expected to increase four-fold by the year 2000.

"Although increased Federal outlays will be required to meet these goals, they can be achieved virtually on a self-liquidating basis, since National Forest timber sales would be expected to reach \$350,000,000 annually by the year 2000, even at 1958 prices," Neuberger said. "This would be more than three times the present revenue of about \$105,000,000."

H. said that short-term objectives of the program call for timber-harvesting practices to accelerate cutting of stagnant stands, remove old-growth timber which impairs reproduction, and encourage reasonable distribution of sales among small, medium and larger operators. The program also provides for maintaining up-to-date inventories of forest lands and completion of timber management plans for all working circles. In addition, early action would be taken to seed or plant about 75 per cent of the 4.4 million acres now available for planting but presently understocked.
