Power Fizzle Hits Bay City

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—A short piece of light cord was blamed for an electrical failure which cut off power in the entire Bayview District here for 22 minutes and put two radio stations off the air.

The power failure occurred Monday at 9:02 a.m. when a 12,000-volt power line exploded in a noisy shower of flame and sparks.

White hot wires fell to the sidewalk, narrowly missing several bystanders. The intense heat touched off several small fires atop the wooden power poles.

Company engineers said the whole trouble was touched off by a section of rubber lamp cord, apparently tossed into the line by a child or a vandal, which caused a cross-current between two lines and then shorted out a transformer.

Power was restored at 9:24 a.m., although a 20-block area served by the exploded line was without power for seven hours.

Damage to the PG&E equipment was expected to run into thousands of dollars.
