Plans were made for not more than 1,000, but the two prime herdfords donated by Con Lynch and Jess Roberts, held out to the last for a delicious meat course. Gib Fleet of Klamath Falls was in charge of the beef preparation.

The branding started at 10 in the morning and was continued in the afternoon after lunch.
