300 Arrested In Argentina

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP)—Some 300 strikers were arrested Thursday night after thousands of rioters and police had turned downtown Buenos Aires into a battlefield.

A visiting dignitary, President Sukarno of Indonesia, was caught in the melee when strikers shouting antigovernment slogans pressed around the open car. Police finally detached the car from the mob.

Two persons were killed when a fourth-story balcony crumpled with battle viewers crashed to the street.

Violence erupted when bank clerks striking for higher wages demonstrated one day before a government deadline for a return to work.
