

Officials Deadlocked On Bowl Proposal

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (AP) — Policy-making faculty representatives of the Big Ten Saturday modified the surprising free-for-all Rose Bowl setup they approved Friday.

The current Rose Bowl contract which expires with the 1960 game was dropped in a stalemate 5-5 vote. By the same standoff ballot the faculty representatives refused to remove from their regulations a clause which authorizes Rose Bowl football competition.

Hillsdale Racing Winner

INGLEWOOD, Calif. (AP) — Hillsdale, a big bay from Indiana, put on a gallant run to the wire Saturday to beat off a last stride challenge by Amerigo and win the \$112,000 Californian at Hollywood Park.

It took a long look at the photo to separate the two at the finish but it came up in favor of C. W. Smith's Hoosier horse by a nose. He was the heavily backed favorite.

Ying And Yang, a long shot, was third and Terrang, the second choice by a crowd estimated at 53,000, was fourth in the field of nine.

The time for the mile and one-sixteenth was 1:44.43.

The windup had the fans in near-hysteria as jockey Willie Shoemaker brought Amerigo, a genuine rogue from England, up on the outside to battle the rail-running Hillsdale.

Hillsdale paid \$3.80, \$2.80 and \$2.60.

The victory was worth a net \$66,800 to Hillsdale's owner and boosted the 4-year-old bay's winnings for 1959 to \$270,250—above of the erstwhile leader, Vertex.

Vertex won the Camden Handicap at Garden State earlier this afternoon and brought his total for the year to \$246,029.

Jockey Tommy Barrow on Hillsdale led the front runners around the track, laying back around third or fourth. Shoemaker was even further back on Amerigo.

The newspaper, quoting "an unimpeachable Eastern source," said American and National League club owners voted approval of the second game at their meeting in Columbus, Ohio, this week.

The regularly scheduled All-Star game will be played this year in Pittsburgh July 7.

Commissioner Ford Frick could not be reached in New York for comment. Friday, however, he told The Associated Press that the decision on a second All-Star game would be made soon, perhaps within a week.

Game Heads Propose Rules

PORTLAND (AP) — The Oregon Game Commission Saturday announced tentative hunting regulations for next year. The proposed regulations call for:

The general deer season to run from Oct. 3 to Oct. 25.

The elk season to be from Oct. 31 to Nov. 22.

The antelope season to be from Aug. 15 through Aug. 19.

Establishment of two hunting areas for taking either-sex deer during the entire season.

Several extended deer seasons for all corners.

Breaking the antelope areas into six units with higher permit quotas.

The commission announced its proposed regulations after a public hearing held Friday. Final regulations will be announced after a second public hearing June 5.

The regulations cover only big game. Upland game, waterfowl and trapping regulations will not be considered by the commission until August.

At Friday's hearing, timbermen complained that deer and elk browsing was threatening the Tillamook Burn reforestation project.

Southern Cal Wins Coast Cinder Meet

Southern California. Cook scooted the 100 in 9.5 seconds and the 220 in 21 flat to earn a share of the records held by three predecessors in each event. Another Oregonian, 141, Otis Davis, ambled the two turns of the 440 in 45.4 and tied the meet standard set by Gordon Klemmer of California back in 1941.

Confusion struck in the day's final event — the mile relay — when California's Jerry Siebert dropped the baton 40 yards from the finish of the third lap. He pulled up in disgust. Jack Yerman, anchor man for the team ran his lap anyway and finished elbow-to-elbow with Washington's Terry Tobacco.

Washington was timed in 3:14.3 but the second-place timers clocked Yerman instead of Bob Shankland of USC, who finished second. The mixup left both USC and fifth-place UCLA untimed.

Another mishap cost Oregon points when Dick Miller, leading the 3-milers into the stretch, stumbled and nearly fell. He finished third behind Frank Wyatt of Idaho and Alan Gaylord of California.

No meet records were bettered in the field events, but four broad jumpers beat the Washington Stadium mark of 24 feet 9 inches, set in 1949 by Henry Alhara of USC. Jim Johnson of UCLA and Darrell Horn of OSC tied for first at 24-9½ and Johnny Kelly of Stanford and Luther Hayes of USC deadlocked for third a quarter-inch short of the winning distance.

White was high point man with 13. In addition to Cook's double in the sprints, Charlie Dumas of USC had a pair of firsts but shared one — the high jump — with teammate Bob Avant. He also won the high hurdles.
