

Play Cast Honored By Woman's Club

FORT JONES—A potluck supper honoring the director and cast of "Father's Been to Mars" was the highlight of the April 28 meeting of the Fort Jones Woman's Club.

Mrs. Lewis Lakes, president of the organization, thanked the cast and praised the group for efforts which gave professional polish to the production. She said the play had been highly successful and attributed much of its success to Mrs. W. J. Pindell, who devoted a great deal of time to directing the comedy.

Forrest Gray, leading man of the play, presented a gold charm bracelet to Mrs. Pindell in appreciation of the time and effort she had contributed. Each member of the cast had added a gold disc to the bracelet to commemorate the event.

Following the supper, Lyman Baker of Seattle presented a historical travelogue of the Oregon Trail. Through colored slides he traced the trail from St. Joseph, Missouri, and down a branch trail to Hangtown, now Placerville, California. He pointed out that the pictures showed tracks and trails visible a century after they were made.

His program has been presented to several organizations recently. Baker has had a life-long interest in Northwest history. He recalls crossing the Oregon Trail in a wagon with his parents during the 1890s. His ambition to delve more deeply into the history of the region was not fully realized until his retirement as superintendent of schools in Seattle a few years ago. Dale and his wife followed the old wagon trail, taking pictures and formulating the historical program. He holds a master's degree from the University of Washington and is a member of Phi Beta Kappa. He now instructs an adult class in Northwest history in Seattle.
