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munity youth centers should not be considered a "cure-all" for meeting the social and recreational needs of young people, warns Charles Martin, a family life specialist from the University of Minnesota.

Martin said too many parents are forgetting "that the major responsibility in preparing their children for adult life belongs to the parents, not schools, churches or community."

In recent years, Martin said, parents have tended to surrender the family functions of teaching, recreation and training to outside agencies. He said these agencies are valuable only when they supplement wholesome family life.

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Kitchen On The Patio Is Something New In Outdoor Living Division

Newest idea for the family fond of outdoor living is a real honest-to-goodness kitchen on the patio, complete with its own permanent refrigeration, storage, cooking and cleanup facilities.

Frigidaire planning experts have built just such a patio kitchen of comparatively simple, inexpensive design. It is a part of one of the company's exciting new 1959 idea kitchens now touring the country.

Serving meals on a patio so equipped can be accomplished with ease by the homemaker. She wastes no time and energy moving food, dishes, utensils, barbecue grill and such outside—everything is ready and waiting there.

For example, in this "second" kitchen there's a compact 9-cubic-foot refrigerator with food and beverages in it; plenty of cabinets for storing dishes and utensils, and two kinds of cooking facilities. There's an electric unit with two heating elements that folds back out of the way when not needed, plus a charcoal grill with adjustable firebox built right into the countertop.

When not being used, it rolls into a niche below the countertop near a small stainless steel sink. Cabinetry and appliances are fitted into an L-shaped arrangement, sheltered by a patio roof.

Inside, the household's "main" kitchen is a dream of efficiency, convenience and elegance. A bold color scheme of blue, gray, white and charcoal lends a touch of sophistication while the design and arrangement of equipment makes for an efficient, effortless way of life in the kitchen for the lucky homemaker.

The kitchen is equipped with both free-standing and built-in appliances which feature Frigidaire's

widely-acclaimed sheer look styling. Handsome, highly-styled cabinetry is by St. Charles.

The cooking center incorporates a variety of clever design ideas. A compact 30-inch electric range has unique French opening doors for easy oven cleaning. The range fits snugly between twin cabinets with stainless steel countertops for hot dishes. Tiny open herb shelves and a knife rack form backpanels on the cabinets. Below is handy compartmented storage space for cooking utensils, cookie sheets and the like. A range hood carries away cooking vapors and odors. Distinctive white tile, which covers the wall behind the range, not only glamorizes the center but is easy to clean.

Another highlight is the food preparation and baking center. A long, mapletop counter with storage above and below extends between two floor-to-ceiling cabinet arrangements. This food preparation center has nooks of scientifically-designed storage. There's a place for everything—dry vegetables, mixing bowls and even paper towels. A food mixer is built into the maple countertop. Also, there is a built-in radio and intercom panel in the wall.
