Pushbutton Farming May Be Close - Tractor Already Used In Initial Testing

OMAHA, Neb. (UPI) — As the tractor rolled out of the warehouse, reporters and salesmen watching it scratched their heads.

The tractor had no driver. But it was controlled — by an engineer walking about 15 feet behind it with a small blue radio set in his hands.

The driverless tractor, developed by Jim Pichon of the University of Nebraska, is seen as a step toward eventual pushbutton farming.

But even Pichon is quick to point out that today's farmer isn't likely to see the day when he can sit back in his easy chair and farm by remote control while watching the operation on closed-circuit television.

Nevertheless, it's in the realm of possibility.

Pichon's radio-operated tractor is a standard production model Oliver tractor with a radio receiver under the seat. The box is hooked up to the all-hydraulic control system on the tractor and the operator has only to push two little red buttons.

By flicking a button one way, the operator can start the tractor. He can shift gears, engage or disengage the clutch and control the speed with other button controls.

He can steer right and left, use the brake and raise or lower the cultivator or plow.

Ray Nash, an engineer who is working with Pichon in an effort to perfect the automatic farmer, explained the radio set to newsmen and salesmen at a convention.

The set has an 11 meter band that transmits high frequency signals on eight control channels and actually is very similar to a remote-control garage door opening system.

It operates on one of two special "citizens band" frequencies set aside by the Federal Communications Commission and only a permit is needed to operate it.

Supermarket Boss Lets Wife Shop

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Wives of supermarket managers say their husbands don't bring home the bacon.

They leave grocery shopping chores to the distaff side. And like most husbands, they rarely have an answer to the age-old question, "What would you like for dinner, dear?"

This was disclosed in an informal survey of family shopping habits by the National Association of Food Chains.

Wives of the nine national winners of the association's annual good citizenship awards for community service also indicated that their husbands were little or no help in meal preparation.

However, some said their husbands occasionally tip them off to good buys in seasonal foods and specials. They felt this helps their families eat better and more economically than the rest of us.

Like any smart homemaker, the supermarket manager's wife asks herself four questions as she makes out her shopping list:

—Will the family like each item? Is it nutritious? Is the price right? Is it in season?

Convenience is also important. One out of the nine wives said she did not stop at her husband's store. It is too far away, she said. Two other markets in his chain are closer home.

Lefties Make Better Batter

CHICAGO (UPI) — Your cake batter may be better if you're left-handed.

A cake mix company executive recently discovered that cakes made by "lefties" differed from those beaten by right-handers.

Edward I. Feigon, research head of his firm, had been puzzled because women on his testing staff kept making cakes of different qualities, though using the same recipes and electric mixers.

He noticed that one woman, a leftie, put an opposite swing on the bowl of the electric mixer, causing interference in the normal rotation of the bowl. This gave the batter more of a battering and caused a higher cake.

But Feigon pointed out that this isn't the case all the time.

"It all depends on the recipe," he said. "Overbeating can improve one recipe and ruin another."
