Foreign Aid Bill Cut; To Render Economic Aid

WASHINGTON (AP) — The nation's foreign aid program had a strong nudge Wednesday in the direction of economic rather than military assistance.

The House Foreign Affairs Committee provided the change of emphasis as it approved late Tuesday a foreign aid authorization bill cut \$266,300,000 below President Eisenhower's request for \$3,930,000,000.

The measure, subject to both House and Senate action and to a change of figures in a later appropriation bill, would authorize new spending of \$3,663,000,000 plus about 21 million dollars of leftover funds.

The cut was only slightly below last year's authorization of \$3,656,400,000.

The over-all reduction, however, does not tell the full story the committee plainly intended to convey to the administration.

It raised by 100 million dollars Eisenhower's proposed 700-million-dollar allocation for loans to help develop backward countries.

And—counter to the trend of foreign aid votes in the House in recent years—it made major cuts in military items.

It was understood the committee also agreed to emphasize in its report that the military reductions are to be made primarily in arms aid to Latin American and other countries not considered to be the potential firing line—as are the NATO countries, South Korea and Nationalist China.

Eisenhower's general military aid item was cut by 160 million dollars—from \$1,600,000,000 to \$1,440,000,000.

The related defense support item, for cash aid to countries straining their budgets through their military efforts, was slashed from \$35 million to 750 million dollars.

The President's contingency fund, to be used on his authority in emergencies, was cut from 200 to 100 million.

One economic aid item, providing for grants, not loans, was trimmed. This is the special assistance fund, cut \$21,800,000 from Eisenhower's recommendation, to an even 250 million.

Bomber Flies Without Crew

WICHITA, Kan. (AP) — The latest model B52 bomber is able to fly thousands of miles, drop its target and return without the aid of the crew.

The feat is made possible by a complex bombing-navigation system which was described Tuesday by the Boeing Airplane Co.

Electronic computers are the key to the system. Before takeoff the navigator would feed the plane's present position into the computer. Boeing said. When airborne, the target site would be fed into the machines and control of the bomber switched to automatic pilot.

The computers then take the plane to the target by the shortest possible route and on the return trip can even control predicted evasive action.

Near the target the crew would take over briefly to check the automatic equipment. Then the bombing system would take over to center on the target.

The guidance system will make the B52G "missile platform" bomber the "world's most potent aerial weapon," Boeing said.

Payment Dip Requested

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Andrew McLaglen says he's paying too much for child support because he's earning more.

Under a 1957 divorce order, the son of actor Victor McLaglen was directed to pay his ex-wife, 38-year-old actress Veda Ann Borg, \$800 monthly alimony. McLaglen, 38, a television producer-director, also was told to pay \$100 monthly and an extra 15 per cent of his gross income over \$1,400 monthly for support of the couple's child Victor II, 4½.

McLaglen's attorney asked for a change in the order to provide a maximum of \$5,000 a year child support and that the percentage be computed on take-home pay rather than gross income.

Ulcers Hit Monkeys Too

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Monkeys are about the same as the average American business executive when it comes to ulcers.

Dr. Robert W. Porter of the UCLA Medical School has found that simians get ulcers and develop arterial disease when subjected to experimental pressures roughly equivalent to those of the businessman.

In the experiments, monkeys constantly met new situations involving electric shock and had to make decisions on how to avoid shocks. The monkeys, under continuous stress of this type, developed stomach ulcers, Dr. Porter said, and there is some indication that hardening of the arteries is developing.
