Father Sees Daughter Die

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP)—A horrified father watched a three-ton ornamental brick wall crush his 13-year-old daughter to death Wednesday scant seconds after he had driven her to school.

Three stunned teen-age boys told police they had braced against the opposite side of the wall in attempt to rock or push a school bus parked within three feet of it. The collapse buried Gloria Rivera as a schoolmate talking to her scrambled to safety.

Gloria's father, Joe Rivera, was powerless to help as the wall fell with deadly suddenness.

Names of the three scared boys were not released but Principal Charles E. Poe of the J. L. Reynolds Junior High School said the tragedy should not be blamed "solely on any of the students."

"Our buildings are supposed to be constructed well enough to take a little horseplay that's bound to be going on in any school," Poe told newsmen.
