Missionaries Slate Talk

The Rev. and Mrs. Norman Dwight, who have recently returned to the United States after spending the last four and one half years in Formosa as missionaries, will speak at the Klamath Temple, 1007 Pine Street, Sunday, May 31, at 7:30 p.m.

They will speak on their missionary experiences in Formosa where the ties of family life are still strong. The talk will be illustrated with colored slides of their work.

Mrs. Dwight is the former Martha Eastman, daughter of Mrs. Marie Eastman and the late Peter Eastman, long-time residents of Klamath Falls.

Norman is the son of the Rev. Albert Dwight, a former pastor of the Covenant Church in this city and now a missionary to Formosa. The Rev. and Mrs. Norman Dwight and five young sons, two born in Formosa, will live here while on furlough.

Mark Pleads For Safety

Three long holiday weekends, which this year combine with an anticipated 25 per cent increase in traffic due to the Centennial celebration, could swell Oregon's traffic death toll to a near-record figure, Gov. Mark O. Hatfield has warned.

The governor made the statement in appealing to drivers for an all-out effort to keep Memorial Day accidents at a minimum. His warning came in the face of a fast-mounting traffic death toll for the year—more than one a day—which by mid-May had resulted in nearly 160 deaths.

State police will be at full patrol strength during the entire Memorial Day holiday, the governor said, but they cannot patrol every mile of every highway in the state. Extra patrols will be assigned to known high-accident locations.

"The final record this Memorial weekend will depend in large measure upon the common sense and judgment of the thousands of drivers who will be on our streets and highways," he said. "If they display patience and courtesy, we can reduce the traffic toll; if they do not, we can expect an even higher toll than last Memorial weekend."

Last year, Memorial weekend was the worst holiday of the year from the standpoint of total accidents and persons injured. Nearly 200 injuries and two deaths were reported in 316 accidents which occurred in the 34-hour holiday period.

SA Captain Gives Counsel

Capt. M. Lewis Kendoll, the Klamath Falls corps officer, gives many hours each week to personal counseling for those who seek such assistance.

This counseling takes many forms. The Salvation Army being a religious organization, many who seek counsel and advice do so for religious purposes. Over the years, we have found, states Capt. Kendoll, that many people today are in need of spiritual assistance, and every Salvation Army officer is trained to provide spiritual counseling for those who need such aid.

Not every person who seeks counsel and advice do so for religious purposes. "We have those who seek aid through a particular crisis in their lives. A mother will come into the office to ask aid for her daughter who is to have a child out of wedlock. We aid that mother in securing admittance into the Salvation Army White Shield Home at Portland for her daughter. In the meantime she is advised and counseled on her immediate needs. In 1958, 26 girls were helped," said Captain Kendoll.

There are those who come regarding personal problems, and when further assistance is necessary the individual is referred to professional persons for further assistance in a particular problem.

During the year 1958 many families were helped to get employment, and long distance telephone calls and telegraph service was provided.

Over 130 hours were given to such counseling.
