Dog Fanciers Contribute Funds To Cover Platform

The smaller dogs entered in the tenth annual Klamath Dog Fanciers' all breed show will parade on a platform floor this year, thanks to members of the local Kennel club.

The dog fanciers organization, headed by Mrs. Kathy McDonald contributed \$150 to the Klamath County Fair Board to provide plywood flooring sections for part of the sales arena at the fairgrounds. The ultimate goal is to have portable flooring for all three rings and Mrs. McDonald said the club will probably contribute the proceeds of this year's show to the same cause. Date of this year's show is September 5.

Klamath Dog Fanciers, Inc., is a nonprofit organization. The group had operated on a more or less informal basis for some five years before it was incorporated on January 11, 1954. The stated purpose of the organization is to encourage ownership and breeding of purebred dogs and to hold shows so that the owners of such dogs can gain points toward championships.

Last year's all breed show drew 416 entries from all over the nation, Mexico and Canada. Many of the dogs are brought in by plane and others come in specially constructed, air-cooled station wagons and panel trucks. It is estimated

that the show brings approximately 600 visitors to Klamath Falls for the Saturday before Labor Day each year.

The show is the second event in the Cal-Ore circuit. The first show is held at Redding on the Friday before Labor Day. Klamath Falls' show is held the following day and then dog owners may show at Medford on Sunday and Eugene on Monday. The four-event show permits the accumulation of possible points toward championship in four separate shows in immediate succession.

Proceeds from the show have built up a fund of \$100 toward the purchase and training of a Seeing Eye Dog for the Blind for some needy Klamath Falls person in addition to generous contributions made to the music department of Klamath Union High School over the years. Last year, the profits from the show went to the KUHS a cappella choir.

Mrs. Helen Maring of Portland will be superintendent of the local show again this year. The show is conducted under the rules of the American Kennel Club and it is expected that trophies alone this year will cost the club nearly \$350. Judges' fees will run nearly \$500 and there are veterinarian's fees, ribbons, printing of the premium

list, rent on the fairgrounds building and other expenses which are borne by the club.

Many of the families which have recently moved to Klamath Falls have brought purebred dogs with them and this year's show is expected to have a larger list of local entries.

Mrs. Leonard P. (Betty) Allen is secretary-treasurer of Klamath Dog Fanciers, Inc., and will be glad to provide entry blanks for this year's show. The club meets regularly once a month at the Klamath County Library and all persons interested in dogs are welcome to attend, Mrs. Allen stated.

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Students Get Ski Lessons

STATELINE, Calif. (UPI)—For about 600 students of the Lake Tahoe Unified School District an "S" has been added to the Three R's. It stands for skiing.

School authorities have designated skiing as a formal part of the school curriculum for pupils from the first to the eighth grades. They receive 15 hours of instruction spread out over a nine-week course at Heavenly Valley resort in the Sierras.

Eric Sailor, former Austrian champion and Heavenly Valley ski school instructor, is in charge of the course. The children are classified as beginners, intermediate or advanced skiers.

According to Chris Kuraisa, Heavenly Valley general manager, "The training these boys and girls receive provides them with the poise that city children might get from ballet lessons or ice skating."

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
