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Court Agrees To Pave Road

A small delegation of Fort Klamath residents approached the county court Friday with a request that a short section of road west of the town be paved.

The road completes a square of about three miles southwest of the town limits. The other three sides of the square are paved.

Leading the visitors were Stewart and Bill Nicholson. The court said it would begin addition of rock, a preliminary to paving this summer.

In a formal action, the court accepted from the Bureau of Indian Affairs a 7-mile road on the Klamath Indian Reservation. The road, designated P-3, extends from Chiloquin northeast to a junction near the Yamsey Ranger Station. The road was recently improved by the Indian Bureau.

Maurice Chevalier, French singing star who has been making a comeback in film and stage revues, was born in Paris on September 12, 1888.

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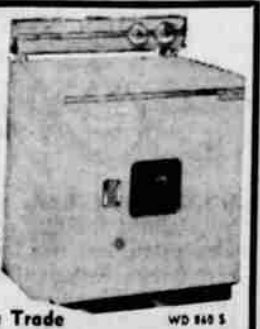
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
