

Portland Beavers Blast Spokane, 8-5

Portland came from behind with the help of home runs, defeating Spokane 8-5 in a Pacific Coast League baseball game Sunday.

Spokane opened the game with three runs in the first off Vic Lombardi, but this margin vanished in the third. Two were on for Portland then, and Spokane pitcher Roger Craig purposely walked a hard-hitting George Freese, loading the bases. Up came Jack Littrell and banged the ball into left center for a homer.

Brave Lefty Seeks Berth In 300 Club

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Milwaukee ace Warren Spahn guardedly is nursing a burning desire. He wants to join the exclusive 300-victory club before hanging up his glove.

"It's a long way off, but it's a challenge and I'm shooting for 300," the 35-year-old southpaw admitted Sunday after stopping the Philadelphia Phillies 2-1 for victory, No. 253 in the National League.

"My immediate goal is winning at least 20 games this season," Spahn said. "But, naturally, I can't help thinking of reaching 300 in the long run."

In earning his seventh victory in 12 decisions this year, Spahn matched the career total of Carl Hubbell, the only National League left-handed pitcher to gain a spot in the Hall of Fame. The biggest southpaw winner in league history was Eppa Rixey, who posted 266 triumphs in 21 years with Philadelphia and Cincinnati.

"Every win counts and is a step in the direction of 300," Spahn said. "I feel as good as ever and I have to admit that 300 is a definite challenge now. But first I have to hit 20 for the season. To my way of thinking, I ought to win 20 a year to keep my job."

Only two southpaws have 300 victories. Eddie Plank won 305 and Lefty Grove just made it, both in the American League.

Spahn's only left-hander to win 20 or more games in nine seasons.

Six days a week the Detroit Tiger's left fielder is a restful sort of a player with a .248 batting average. On Sundays Maxwell turns into a home run terror.

Maxwell uncorked his Sunday punch again Sunday. He stunned reliever Jim Perry with a tie-breaking three-run shot in the ninth inning, giving the Tigers a 7-4 victory over the Cleveland Indians.

His Sunday batting average is .333. His average Monday through Saturday is .224.

"I wonder where the fish are biting," drawled Maxwell after his same winner Sunday. "I ought to go fishing the rest of the week. There's no reason why I do my best hitting on Sunday."

Then he added with a wink: "I'm just a crowd pleaser I guess."

Mick Wright Open Winner

VIRGINIA BEACH, Va. (AP) — Long-hitting Mickey Wright won the \$6,000 Virginia Beach Women's Invitation Golf Tournament and gained stature both as golfer and as prognosticator.

On the eve of the first round of the 54-hole tournament for lady professionals last Thursday, the Bonita, Calif. golfer predicted she could shoot a 207 and that it would win.

She did, and it did. One stroke behind Beverly Hanson of Ingle, Calif., going into Sunday's final 18 holes, Miss Wright nosed to victory on a closing 70 after earlier rounds of 70 and 67.

Miss Hanson, with previous rounds of 67 and 69, had a closing 73 for a 54-hole total of 209 to give her second money of \$769.50.

Third place went to Fay Crocker of Montevideo, Uruguay, who took down \$308.50 on rounds of 73-72-60-214. Next was Bonnie Radtke of Naples, Fla., with 69-72-75-215 and \$484.50.

Ortega will report Tuesday to the Dodgers' Spokane farm club in the Triple-A Pacific Coast League.

Ed Machen, Johansson See Judge

NEW YORK (UPI) — The Eddie Machen - Ingemar Johansson return-bout suit was scheduled to go to trial today before Federal Judge Irving R. Kaufman.

Attorneys representing Machen, Johansson, and heavyweight champion Floyd Patterson were unable to reach an out-of-court settlement Friday during a huddle with Judge Kaufman, and he ordered it to trial.

Heavyweight contender Machen of Redding, Calif., is trying to return challenger Johansson of Sweden from fighting Patterson for the title at Yankee Stadium, June 25.

Machen wants the court to return Johansson to fulfill a return-bout agreement with him before he fights Patterson.

The return-bout agreement was drawn at Goeteborg, Sweden, last Sept. 13 — the day before Johansson became challenger by knocking out Machen in the first round at Goeteborg.

Johansson did not sign the agreement. It was signed by Edwin Ahlqvist, Goeteborg promoter and magazine publisher, whom Machen insists was Ingemar's manager. Johansson maintains that Ahlqvist was merely his "advisor" and not his manager—and that he had no legal right to sign the agreement. Papa Jens Johansson was his legal manager at that time, blonde Ingemar declares.

Machen Win No Help To Johansson Camp

NEW YORK (NEA) — Eddie Machen could have contributed generously to the Floyd Patterson-Ingemar Johansson match at Yankee Stadium, June 25, when he boxed Ruben Vargas in the scrap nationally TV'd from San Francisco the other night.

The way things turned out, however, Machen added nothing to what little line American ring-worms have on Johansson, who obtained the championship match on the strength of quickly belting out the reluctant young man from Redding on a cool evening in Gothenburg last fall.

The best Machen could do was win an unpopular decision from Vargas, a rather slow, mauling club fighter, by a margin of no more than seven points on the cards of the three officials. Vargas is supposed to be a self-educated philosopher, a student of Shakespeare and a lover of good music and the arts. It also was obvious that he took a correspondence course in boxing.

Johansson has failed to impress in his early workouts at Grossinger's. He appears to lack speed of hands. He carries his hands high, never jabbing with his left, tips off his right by dipping the shoulder and you can see it coming. He is the same guy who Joe Erskine, who was knocked out in five by Brian London.

The ridiculous hand-picking of Patterson's opponents has reached the stage where even sports writers—ordinarily the most sedentary and pacific of individuals—are crying for a shot at the champion and the big dough that comes with it. Bill Reynard, sports editor of the Ashtabula, O., Star-Beacon, has flung such a challenge.

Commenting on Cus D'Amato's paying tribute to London's gameness after his frightful exhibition "Let me have a crack at Patterson. I have gameness I even haven't used yet."

In a letter to Manager D'Amato, Reynard writes: "You might be interested, since it is well known that you like to sign to stop fighters no one ever heard of before. If you are looking for another unknown to tune up on after Patterson cuffs Johansson, you can't find one any more unknown than me. I am an unknown I haven't even been in a ring yet."

"As I see it, anyone can go a few rounds with Patterson, and I can be as polite as the next fellow if the price is right. The best part of this deal would be that your boy would be in no danger. I couldn't hurt him if the referee held his arms and I had a sledgehammer. This ideal may sound
