His Excellency, the Most Reverend Francis P. Leipzig, presided at graduation exercises at Sacred Heart Academy Monday, May 25. Twenty eight students were graduated.

In his address to the graduates and their parents, Bishop Leipzig reminded them of the benefits of Catholic education and its influence on their lives. He used, as an example, the heroine from California who recently rescued a fellow student when he had been attacked by a shark, and who baptized him after the rescue.

The bishop quoted the girl as saying she owed her courage and her clear sightedness to her faith and to her Catholic education.
