Surplus Power Of PNW Available To California

OLYMPIA (AP) — The Pacific Northwest will have surplus power to sell to California for the next 10 years, but most of it will be available during the summer months, Washington state officials said Tuesday.

Earl Coe, state director of conservation, presented the findings at a meeting of power experts representing California, Oregon and Washington.

The meeting was one of a series to discuss the feasibility of constructing a power line connecting the power grid of the Pacific Northwest with that in California. The line would permit the shifting of surplus power from one area to another as the demand shifted.

The Pacific Northwest power study, made by Truman P. Price,
