

Sweet Corn Markets Early

WASHINGTON (UPI)—It might as well be summer, for folks who like corn on the cob.

The United Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Association reports that a bumper crop of sweet corn from Florida's reclaimed swamplands is now coming to market several weeks ahead of schedule.

High quality is maintained by quick chilling of the vegetable in packing houses at the fields where it is packed. The crated corn is given a series of ice cold showers, then rushed to fast freight

cars, where it is chilled with snow ice during shipment to markets. Unless sweet corn is refrigerated soon after picking, the sugar in it begins changing to starch, the association reported.

In choosing sweet corn, it added, look for a cob neatly spaced with smooth, milky kernels, just plump enough to show slight resistance when pressed. Husks should be a clear green.
