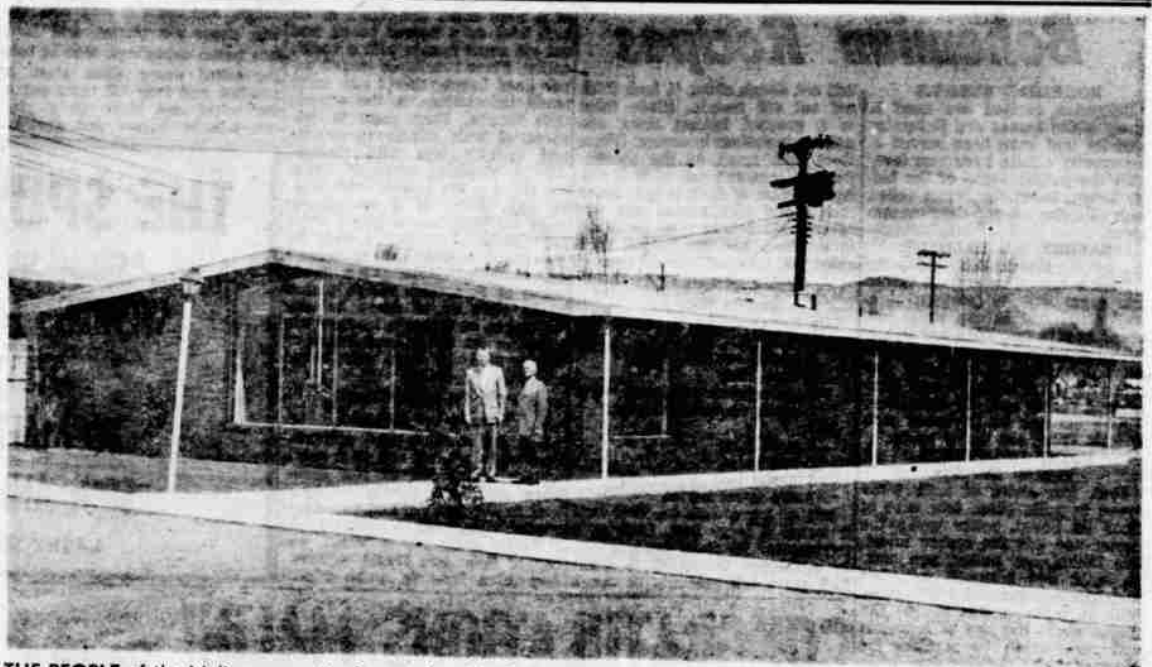

He cited the lady bug in particular which preys on aphids now here in detrimental numbers. Past president's pins were presented to the retiring heads of both clubs. A short business session concluded the program.
