Cape "Birdwatchers" Forever On The Ball

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (UPI)—When the Air Force decided to play games with the familiar red warning ball here recently, it didn't upset the hundreds of amateur "birdwatchers" on nearby beaches.

For these birdwatchers seem to have a "grapevine" all their own. The proof can be found in the hundreds and sometimes thousands who gather over bonfires south of the Air Force Missile Test center whenever a missile firing is imminent.

Until several weeks ago, hoisting of the red warning ball to the top of its pole on the southeast corner of the Cape was a sure sign that something was afoot. But it doesn't work that way any more.

The red ball device was rigged to warn fishing boats that frequent the Cape area to steer clear of a safety lane several miles wide in the ocean.

Back before the Air Force began telling reporters in confidence of pending missile firing times, the warning ball was the first thing the newsmen looked for when they arose each morning. And many members of the curious throngs who came to the beaches in those early days learned to look for the same sign.

A few weeks ago, however, the Air Force left the warning ball up for a solid week—including several days when nothing was scheduled and nothing was fired.

And what happened? Nothing. The lack of birdwatchers on the beaches only served to prove that there is a hard core of veterans who get the word without benefit of newspapers, radio, television—or the red ball.

Navy Chief Army Brat

WASHINGTON (UPI)—NATO's naval commander, Adm. Jerard Wright, 60, is an Army brat who went "wrong."

His father was a distinguished career Army officer, the late Lt. Gen. William Mason Wright. "Jerry" Wright grew up on Army posts around the world. But he chose to make his own career in the Navy, in which he's spent nearly 46 years.

It has been a distinguished career, capped by his present dual assignment as NATO's "Supreme Allied Commander Atlantic" and as Commander in Chief of the U.S. Atlantic Fleet. He has held both posts since 1954, administering his far-flung responsibilities from a joint headquarters at Norfolk, Virginia.

The amateur birdwatchers won't shed any light on how they hear of a forthcoming shoot.

There has been speculation that some missile workers tip off their wives that a shoot is coming up. But nobody's been able to prove it. And most workers at the Cape realize that if they were caught doing so, the consequences could be rough.

At any rate, a veteran reporter at the Cape recalls that shortly before one of the early Vanguard firings there was a 30-minute suspension in the countdown. He took advantage of the situation to rush to a nearby diner to order a few hamburgers.

When a stranger in the diner learned the reporter was in town for the Vanguard firing, he casually remarked: "Well, you better get on back to your place in a hurry—that 30-minute hold's been cut to 15 minutes."

It was.
