Governor Threatens Hoodlums

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—The probe on "gangland pressure" in the boxing industry gets under way here today — pushed along by the announcement by Gov. Edmund G. (Pat) Brown that he would have special investigators assigned to study the problems.

The state Athletic Commission will conduct the hearings, which are expected to feature Ralph Gambina, who "bought in" on the contract of heavyweight contender Rubeen Vargas for \$500.

The commission does not have anything listed on its agenda that would call for further discussion of the promoter Jackie Leonard case. But Gov. Brown does.

Leonard, who testified before the commission last month that Eastern mobsters, including Frankie Carbo and Blinky Palermo, were trying to muscle into the fight game, still is recovering from a beating he received after the testimony.

"I'm determined that that kind of activity finds no place in California," said Brown. "I'm going to ask Atty. Gen. Stanley Mosk to assign some of his investigators to the athletic commission to find the answers on who made that attack on Leonard."

On a 24-point commission hearing agenda, Gambina is slated to be under discussion at least four or five times. The commission will consider fining him for conduct at a recent match in Palm Springs; ask him to clarify some of his charges that "fighters opposing a Sid Flabert boxer in San Francisco can't get an even break"; ask him why Larry Boardman, whom he manages, withdrew from the June 13 fight in Los Angeles; and how he purchased an interest in Vargas for \$500.

East Side, Superior Squads Nab BR League Victories

A pair of last surges gave both East Side Electric and Superior Troy Laundry victories in Babe Ruth League action in Gem Stadium Wednesday night.

Third sacker Kent Hunsaker powered a first baseline triple that broke up a 3-5 tie between the East Siders and Henley Sporting Goods to hand the Electricians a 3-5 triumph in the extra-inning first game.

Seventeen Superior Troy batters paraded before three K Amusement pitchers in the top of the fifth inning and collected 12 runs in the process to complete a 19-4 debacle in the second.

In a game that featured three sparkling triples and a double the East Side nine got away to a run lead in the first frame as Bill Kenner connected for a three-master. Another threebagger in the fourth by catcher Dave Stippich gave the East Side club a 4-3 margin and the final triple by Hunsaker wrapped it up.

The victory was credited to pitcher Jay Paxton who went the full distance. The loss was charged to Henley's John Crumrine who also went all the way.

Henley grabbed a 3-5 lead in the second off a sacrifice, a single by shortstop Ken Quigley and two EE errors. Two more errors and a one base rap by leftfielder Mike Tacchini gave them a brief 4-2 lead in the third. A double by Crumrine and a single by Quigley gave the Sporting Goods nine a 5-3 tie in the last of the fifth. Seventeen walks in five innings were the deciding factors in the Superior Troy triumph. Starting K Amusement hurler, young Mentie Cortez, issued 12 of them before finally being lifted in the disastrous fifth. He was charged with the loss and was relieved by Bert Denham who failed to get an out, the inning being finished by Jim Maxwell who moved to the mound from second base.

The winning chucker, little Marv Cunningham, spaced six KA hits in the five innings.

Superior centerfielder John Grems collected a pair of singles and a double while Bill Bianchi got two singles and three RBIs for the losers.

Real 'Productive' Bunt

Baltimore Shares Lead; Yankees Move Up

Shades of John McGraw and the other fabled old Orioles, but did you see how the modern Orioles stormed into first place on a three-run bunt?

Woe Willie Keeler himself never laid down a more productive bunt and old Wilbert (Uncle Robbie) Robinson would have approved the way Willie Tashy just kept on rumblin' while the Cleveland Indians were throwing the ball where their teammates weren't.

It all happened in the fifth inning Tuesday night when the fabulous bunt led to a 7-3 victory and sent the Orioles soaring into a tie with the Chicago White Sox for the American League lead — the first time in the modern history of the club it has occupied or shared the top rung.

Of course, a couple of "rabbit-ball" homers by Gene Woodling and Chico Carasquel did help out but the big moment for the second largest crowd in Baltimore's baseball history came when Paul Richards told Tashy to bunt with none out, two runners on via walks and the Indians leading, 3-2, in the fifth inning.

The San Francisco Giants beat the Pittsburgh Pirates, 6-2, and moved within two games of the National League lead when the St. Louis Cardinals routed the first-place Milwaukee Braves, 12-3. The Los Angeles Dodgers shaded the Philadelphia Phillies, 3-2, and the Chicago Cubs beat Cincinnati, 8-4.

Orioles 7, Indians 3
Tashy—flying down that line like

Sam (Jimmy) Sheppard himself—beat it out for a single and both runners scored to put the Orioles in front, 4-3, when pitcher Mudcat Grant threw the ball into right field. That also let Tashy reach third base and the no-no-Wee Willie streaked home when Rocky Celavito threw wildly to the edge of the stands.

The Washington Senators gave the Orioles an assist when they topped the White Sox, 7-4. The New York Yankees reached the first division for the first time since April 25 with a 13-inning, 9-8 victory over the Kansas City Athletics and the Boston Red Sox ended the Detroit Tigers' four-game winning streak, 5-2, in other American League games.

Two homers by rookie Bob All-

son kept the Senators in their game with the White Sox and they finally won it when relief pitcher Turk Lown hit one man with the bases filled and forced in two more with walks in the eighth inning.

Yanks 9, KC 8
Hector Lopez scored the tying run after a triple in the ninth and singled home the decisive 13th-inning run for the Hankees who reached the 500-mark and went into a fourth-place tie with the Tigers.

Boston 5, Detroit 2
Jerry Casale doubled to clinax a five-run first-inning Boston rally and then pitched a four-hitter for his fourth victory.

Giants 6, Bucs 2
Johnny Antonelli's five-hit pitch-

ing and three hits each by Willie Kirkland and Orlando Cepeda enabled the Giants to hand the Pirates their fifth loss in six games.

Cards 6, Braves 3
Ken Boyer drove in four runs with a homer, double and single to lead a 16-hit St. Louis attack that also included three hits each by Don Blasingame and Willie White.

Bums 3, Phillies 2
Wally Moon, who tripled and scored in the fourth inning, doubled home the decisive run in the sixth inning for the A's.

Cubs 8, Cincy 4
Homers by Ernie Banks, Dale Long and Bobby Thomson led the Cubs to their sixth win in seven games on the wings of a 16-hit attack over the Reds.
